April 2009

- An article was written for NewsDESk, to update staff on a new initiative where Cleansing Services and Enterprise formed a partnership with Proper Oils, to collect used cooking oil from City restaurants. All the oil collected is refined locally into biodiesel and Enterprise use some of this to partly fuel our waste collection vehicles.
- The Green Team helped the City of London Festival collect materials to be reused by schools to make costumes for the Festival's opening procession, which had a sustainability theme. Boxes were placed in staff kitchens to collect items such as CDs, floppy discs, books, crisp packets and cans.
