Whereupon the Lord Mayor declared Deputy John Barker to have been appointed on the Society for the Relief of the Homeless Poor.

Questions a) **Mr Lord** asked the Chairman of the City Lands and Bridge House Estates Committee a question about whether a photograph of Her Majesty The Queen should be provided in the entrance to the West Wing of Guildhall.

In response, **the Chairman** confirmed that such a photograph would be placed on the wall behind the receptionist in the West Wing entrance.

b) **Deputy Michael Welbank** asked the Chairman of the Policy and Resources Committee provide statistical information on Freedom of Information Act (FOI) requests.

In response, the **Chairman** reported that 544 requests had been made in 2009, of which 409 were answered in full. There were 94 requests that the City could answer either in part or not at all and the City did not hold the information requested in 34 requests. The final 7 were withdrawn. He confirmed that there was a trend for an increased number of requests and for 2010 there was expected to be a 23% increase over those received in 2009. He added that the increasing volume was such that another member of staff in the Town Clerk's department was about to receive training to help deal with that. He concluded that for the twelve months from June 2009 to June 2010 the cost of dealing with the requests was probably around £160,000 of City Fund expenditure.

In reply to a supplementary from **Deputy Welbank** the Chairman stated that there was an obligation upon public authorities to provide information at no charge if the request can be dealt with in less than twenty hours of officer time. The time spent on FOI work, when resources were tight, was a concern which could be shared with other authorities. In response to a supplementary from **Mr Lord** the Chairman confirmed that Freedom of Information Act requests were considered in relation to the City's work as a local authority and as most of the work of the Court of Aldermen related to City's Cash, its activities were largely outside the scope of the Act.

c) **Mr Martinelli** asked the Chairman of the Police Committee whether the City of London Police had any role in the selection of the pathologist who carried out the initial post-mortem on Ian Tomlinson, the news vendor who collapsed and died shortly after being hit by a policeman during the G20 protests in 2009. In response, the **Chairman** advised that neither the City of London Police, nor the City Corporation had any involvement in the selection of a pathologist. He added that that decision had been made by the Coroner and he remained completely independent from the City Police and from the City of London Corporation. In response to a supplementary from **Mr Martinelli**, the **Chairman** reiterated that the appointment of the pathologist was in the hands of the Coroner and he was completely independent from the City Police and from the City of London Corporation. In response to a supplementary from **Mr Mooney**, the **Chairman** reminded Members that he had already undertaken to advise the Court of the situation following the conclusion of the on-going investigations and processes of both the Independent Police Complaints Commission and the Metropolitan Police. In response to a supplementary from **Mr Hudson**, the **Chairman** was unable to confirm whether the City had issued a formal response to correct the false impression given in press reports on the subject but he undertook to discuss this matter with Mr Hudson after the meeting.
