11. Awards and Prizes UNESCO Memory of the World Register – Inscription for the Robert Hooke Diary held at London Metropolitan Archives Report of the Chairman of the Culture, Heritage and Libraries Committee

> "I am delighted to announce that the City Corporation's London Metropolitan Archives (LMA) has been successful in having a third inscription awarded for the

UNESCO Memory of the World Register for one of the archives in its care.

The United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organisation's (UNESCO) Memory of the World Initiative was set up in the 1990s to preserve and promote outstanding global documentary heritage. Following this, in 2010 UNESCO started a UK Register for items with cultural significance specific to this country which complements the International Register.

The City Corporation's London Metropolitan Archives already had two inscriptions on the Register before 2014. These are for the 1067 William Charter, the City's oldest archive, and the 1940-45 London County Council Bomb damage maps (all items owned by the City Corporation). Now there is a third inscription for the diary of Robert Hooke.

Robert Hooke was a major scientific figure, at the forefront of physics, astronomy, microscopy, physiology and geology and was the first UK professional experimental scientist, appointed as Curator of Experiments to the Royal Society in 1662. Hooke contributed greatly to the rebuilding of the City of London after the 1666 Great Fire and the Diary contains daily entries for his work as the Chief City Surveyor for the rebuilding of the City, measuring and arbitrating rival property claims so that the City could quickly grow anew. The Diary is a rich and important source for both the history of the City of London and the history of science.

2014 European Succeed Award for the Great Parchment Book

Report of the Chairman of the Culture, Heritage and Libraries Committee

"I am also delighted to announce that the City Corporation's London Metropolitan Archives (LMA) has been awarded a 2014 European Succeed Award for the Great Parchment Book project.

The project is one which the LMA has worked on with the Centre for Digital Humanities at University College London (UCL) in a ground-breaking initiative to conserve, digitally reconstruct, transcribe and publish the Great Parchment Book, an iconic item in the archive of The Honourable The Irish Society lodged at LMA. This volume is a key document in the history of Northern Ireland as it records a survey of the seventeenth century estates, but until this project it was illegible as it had been badly damaged in a fire at Guildhall in 1786. LMA's role was to research and then carry out conservation treatment to relax and open up the parchment of the book. Images of the parchment were then taken by UCL and specially developed software enabled text to be read for the first time. LMA then transcribed and encoded the text to enable it in turn to be presented online.

LMA is grateful for financial support for its work from eight of the Great Twelve Livery Companies whose estates are recorded in the Great Parchment Book; the Marc Fitch Fund and the National Manuscripts Conservation Trust. Further thanks should go to the Irish Society which also helped fund a website to showcase the project.

I commend these achievements to the Court.

Crossrail Art Foundation

The City of London Corporation has been a strong supporter of Crossrail for nearly 25 years and considers the delivery of the Project to be vital to the future prosperity and economic success of the City, London and the UK.

In addition to making a direct contribution to Crossrail of £200m, the City Corporation has also agreed to provide matched funding from City's Cash of half of the total estimated cost (not exceeding £3.5 million) plus up to £250, 000 towards set-up costs of delivering a Crossrail Art Strategy. To this end we have now considered proposals for the City Corporation to establish a charitable company with Crossrail Ltd. It is intended that the company should be known as the Crossrail Art Foundation and that it will provide an arms-length entity to achieve the outcomes of the Arts Strategy, including seeking donations/sponsorship from the private sector.

The arrangements for the company also include the appointment of three Members of the Court of Common Council as Members and Directors (Trustees) of the company.

A printed and circulated report is now submitted for your consideration and we commend its recommendations in relation to the establishment of a charitable company (intended to be known as the Crossrail Art Foundation) with Crossrail Ltd, the appointment of the three company Trustees and the delegations required to progress the formation of the company to you.

(B) **600th Anniversary of the Battle of Agincourt**

It is proposed that the City of London Corporation hosts a lecture followed by a reception at Guildhall in March 2015 as part of a national programme of commemorative events planned to mark the 600th anniversary of the Battle of Agincourt. These include a service in Westminster Abbey, exhibitions in Parliament and at the Tower of London, and a university conference. The commemorations are being planned in close liaison with diplomatic representatives of France and the other countries involved as allies of either side, and will be presented as an important milestone in our countries' shared heritage.

There is a strong historical connection with the City of London and Livery Companies. The City provided the King with a loan of 10,000 marks (almost £3 million today) to fund the King's campaign in France, receiving from him as security a gold livery collar.

The guest list would include academics, historians, diplomats, representatives from Livery Companies, the City's Privileged Regiments, the Museum of London, students from the City Academies and schools, and Members with relevant interests.

We **recommend** that hospitality be granted and that arrangements be left in the hands of the Hospitality Working Party; the cost to be met from City's Cash, within the approved cost parameters.

Thames Estuary Partnership

The City Corporation, in its role as London Port Health Authority (LPHA), is a partner with the charity the 'Thames Estuary Partnership' (TEP) with which it works closely on matters such as shellfish in the estuary and water quality of the river. The TEP undertakes a range of functions, including coordination of a projects programme, facilitation of new projects and forums for joint working, and organisation of events and workshops.

The TEP has invited the City to take on a role of Corporate Director/Trustee, but it is not the City's usual practice to make such appointments. Rather, it is normal practice to appoint a Member of the Court of Common Council to serve in an individual capacity and these appointments are normally made by the Court of Common Council after seeking expressions of interest and by the holding of a ballot where there is more than one expression of interest.

Given the close working relationship between the City as the LPHA and the TEP, it would be advantageous for the City Corporation to maintain those links by appointing a Member to the TEP Board. Nigel Challis (a member of the Port Health and Environmental Services Committee between 2008 and 2014) has been acting as the Corporation's representative and has indicated that he is prepared to continue to do so. Mr Challis has built up a good understanding of the TEP's work and has made a considerable contribution to the Board.

Given the interest shown by Mr Challis in this position and his first-hand experience of the work of the TEP to date, his appointment was approved by the Port Health and Environmental Services Committee and we now **recommend** that approval be given to the appointment of Nigel Challis as Corporate Director/Trustee of the Thames Estuary Partnership.

17B. Amendments to the Members' Code of Conduct - Disclosable Interests and the Mandatory Registration of Gifts and Hospitality

In accordance with our terms of reference, the Standards Committee is required to prepare, keep under review and monitor the City of London Corporation's Members' Code of Conduct and make recommendations to the Court of Common Council in respect of the adoption or revision, as appropriate, of such Code of Conduct.

Due to the nature of the organisation and the wide-ranging business undertaken by Members of the Court of Common Council, your Committee believes that a number of additional categories, which would require Members to register a broader range of non-pecuniary interests, should be introduced. As there are a broad range of organisations in which City of London Members are involved, the Code of Conduct and the Members' Declarations should therefore better reflect the nature and business of the City of London Corporation, particularly where there might be a perception of influence being exerted. In reaching its decision, this Committee has taken into account the previous Standards regime, whereby Members were expected to register a more substantial list of membership bodies. The Committee also reflected on practice across local authorities and noted that some, including some London Boroughs, had retained similar provisions in their Codes of Conduct. This Committee believes that transparency and the disclosure of relevant interests should be the guiding principle and therefore **recommends** the inclusion of an additional number of categories which would require Members to register a broader range of non-pecuniary interests. In respect of gifts and hospitality, your Committee believes that a mandatory registration regime is required given the circumstances at the City of London Corporation and the extent of gifts and hospitality offered to Members and Co-opted Members. With regards to the threshold for registration, your Committee acknowledges that whilst the £250 threshold (or £500 cumulative value) is high in comparison with a number of local authorities, this is deemed to be an appropriate threshold taking into account the nature of the organisation

A printed and circulated report has therefore been submitted for your consideration and **we commend** its recommendations to revise the Members' Code of Conduct and to introduce a mandatory registration regime for gifts and hospitality, as of 1st September 2014.

Read.

The Chairman introduced the item.

Motion – To approve the proposed revisions to the Members' Code of Conduct and the introduction of a mandatory registration regime for gifts and hospitality, as set out in Appendix 1 to this report, and that the new requirements come into effect as of 1_{st} September 2014, following circulation of revised guidance to Members about the new provisions in the Members' Code of Conduct and circulation of the annual reminder to all Members and Co-opted Members to update their Members' Declarations.

Following a debate the following amendments were considered:-

Ann *Amendment* - that paragraph 8 of the Code set out in Appendix 1 of the report be strengthened by inserting the words "maintain" and "uphold" so that it now read as follows:-

8. You must *maintain, uphold,* promote and support high standards of conduct when serving in your public post, in particular as characterised by the above requirements, by leadership and example.

Upon the Question being put, the Lord Mayor declared the amendment to be carried.

• Management board or similar body of any charity or body directed to a charitable purpose which is *likely to seek to affect the policy of the City Corporation or which may have an impact on its services or stakeholders.*

Upon the Question being put, the Lord Mayor declared the amendment to be carried.

Further debate ensued on whether the proposed Code as amended and before the Court was too prescriptive and whether the matter should, as a consequence, be referred back to the Standards Committee for further consideration at a meeting to which all Members of the Court should be invited to attend.

Resolved – That the Members' Code of Conduct be referred back to the Standards Committee for further consideration at a meeting of that Committee to be held prior to the meeting of the Court of Common Council on 11 September 2014, to which all Members of the Court should be invited to attend.

On 24 June 2014, your Education Board considered issues relating to the appointment of governors at the City Academy Hackney and the City of London Academy Southwark. Report – Community and Children's Services Committee

Decent Homes upgrade works to Avondale Square Estate, Holloway Estate (partial) and William Blake Estate.

To be presented on Thursday, 11th September 2014

To the Right Honourable The Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled.

Summary

As part of the rolling maintenance of the City of London Corporation's Housing stock, a structured programme of works has been planned with the intent to bring certain facilities within residential properties owned by the City of London Corporation up to 'Decent Homes' standard.

As part of this programme, your Committee has considered specific improvements to the kitchen, bathroom and central heating facilities within residential properties at the Avondale Square, Holloway and William Blake Estates. In accordance with the City's Procurement Regulations 2012, we now recommend the approval of the Court of Common Council to undertake these works.

Recommendations

We **recommend** that the Court of Common Council approves the procurement of a contractor to complete the necessary works to replace kitchens, bathrooms and central heating systems at the three estates.

Main Report

Background

- 1. In 2000, the then government announced that all properties let on social housing tenancies were required to meet the 'Decent Homes Standard' by 2010. The City of London Corporation carried out a programme of assessment and works at that time, in order to ensure the standard was achieved across all social housing stock. Continuing to maintain the 'decency' of housing stock remains part of a landlord's responsibility.
- 2. Surveys are being conducted across the estates to confirm the condition of kitchens, bathrooms and central heating systems, noting those that would cause the property to fail to meet the Decent Homes standard. A programme of works will be established to replace those that fall below standard in each property, with works undertaken only in those properties that require immediate action.

Current Position

- 3. Carrying out repairs on an 'ad hoc' basis puts strain on both the responsive repairs and voids budgets. On average, individual kitchen replacements cost £6,000, bathroom replacements cost £4,000 and central heating replacements cost £4,500 via responsive repairs.
- 4. Significant economies of scale can be achieved through carrying out a scheduled programme of works. For example, when the programme of Decent Homes upgrade works was carried out in 2010 to the York Way Estate, kitchen replacements cost £5,000 and bathroom replacements cost £3,000 (on average).
- 5. It is anticipated that the contractor appointed to carry out the kitchen, bathroom and central heating replacements on the Avondale Square, Holloway and William Blake Estates under this programme will be able to offer appropriate cost reductions, following principles of economies of scale.

Proposal

6. It is proposed that the City Corporation proceed with procuring a contractor to complete the necessary works to replace kitchens, bathrooms and central heating systems at the three estates. This option offers the benefit of planned expenditure, the cost savings of economies of scale and the efficiency of completing the works in a scheduled fashion.

Corporate and Strategic Implications

7. The proposals support the strategic aims and policy priorities of seeking to maintain the quality of our public services whilst reducing our expenditure and improving our efficiency, and to provide modern, efficient and high quality local services and policing within London and the nation for workers, residents and visitors with a view to delivering sustainable outcomes.

Financial Implications

8. The total estimated project cost is £5,793,750 and is modelled using the data from the surveys that have been carried out. It is important to note that this estimate is subject to change based upon two major factors: the price achieved at tender and the number of properties where works are completed – which will vary dependent upon survey outcomes and access for works.

Conclusion

9. A structured programme of works will bring the kitchen, bathroom and central heating facilities within residential properties up to Decent Homes standards. Members of the Court are asked to approve the improvement works.

All of which we submit to the judgement of this Honourable Court.

Report of the Standards Committee Appointment of Co-opted Members

To be presented on Thursday, 11th September 2014

To the Right Honourable The Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled.

Summary

The Standards Committee comprises twelve Members, four of whom are co-opted and are independent from the City Corporation. Whilst Co-opted Members are no longer a statutory requirement and have no formal vote, following the introduction of the Localism Act 2011, the City of London Corporation has agreed to the inclusion of Co-opted Members on the Committee to maximise the breadth of knowledge and experience available.

There are currently two co-opted vacancies and following a recruitment exercise two candidates, Mr Mark Greenburgh and Mr Dan Large have been nominated by the Selection Panel to serve on the Standards Committee.

Recommendation

We **recommend** that the Selection Panel's recommendation that Mr Mark Greenburgh and Mr Dan Large be appointed to serve as Co-opted Members of the Standards Committee for four-year terms expiring in December 2018 be approved.

(To be brought into effect, this recommendation requires the approval of a majority of the Members of the authority and it will, therefore, be necessary to BALLOT on this item.)

Main Report

- 1. The Standards Committee comprises twelve Members, four of whom are Coopted Members and must be independent from the City Corporation (ie. must not be Common Councilmen). Whilst Co-opted Members are no longer a statutory requirement and no longer have a formal vote, following the introduction of the Localism Act 2011, the City of London Corporation has approved the inclusion of Co-opted Members on the Standards Committee to maximise the breadth of knowledge and experience on the Committee. Coopted Members are entirely separate from the three statutory "Independent Persons" appointed under the Localism Act 2011 who must be consulted in relation to any investigation but who are not formal members of the Committee.
- 2. Following an appointment exercise in autumn 2013 to appoint to three vacancies for Co-opted Members of the Committee as a result of the completion of the terms of office of Dr Colin Kolbert, Howard Lederman and Felicity Lusk, Judith Barnes was appointed and Felicity Lusk was reappointed by the Court in November 2013. A further vacancy arose in the room of Mr Alan Graham following the expiry of his term of office in March 2014.
- At the 1st May meeting of the Court of Common Council, your Committee 3. sought approval to revise the composition of the Selection Panel for the purposes of short-listing and interviewing applicants for Co-opted Member roles on the Standards Committee. The previous composition, which included the Chairman of the Policy and Resources Committee, the Chairman of the General Purposes Committee of Aldermen and the Chief Commoner (or their representatives), was agreed by the Court of Common Council in 2000 when the new Standards Committee was established and when no Chairman or Deputy Chairman of the new Committee existed. On the grounds that the Standards Committee's arrangements were now firmly established, and in view of revisions to the selection panel arrangements for other decision making bodies comprising of elected and Co-opted Members over recent years, including the Police and the Audit and Risk Management Committees, the Court agreed that the composition of the Selection Panel (Co-opted Members of the Standards Committee) should be revised to include the Chairman of the Standards Committee, the Deputy Chairman of the Standards Committee, the Chief Commoner and the Chairman of the General Purposes Committee of Aldermen (or their representatives).
- 4. The recent recruitment and selection process commenced in December 2013. Three valid applications were received and considered by the Selection Panel on 15th July 2014. Due to a personal interest arising from the Chairman's knowledge of two of the candidates, Alderman Julian Malins acted as the Chairman's representative for the purposes of both the selection and interview stage and also approved the matter in accordance with the City Corporation's urgency procedures.
- 5. The purpose of this report is to seek approval to the recommendation of the Selection Panel that Mr Mark Greenburgh and Mr Dan Large be appointed to fill the existing Co-opted Member vacancies. The recommendations of the Selection

Panel were considered by the Standards Committee in accordance with Standing Order 41 (b) to ensure that the appointments process was not unnecessarily delayed. All Members of the Committee were advised of the recommendations ahead of the decision being approved by the Town Clerk in consultation with the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Standards Committee.

- 6. **Mr Mark Greenburgh** has not previously served as a Co-opted Member of the Standards Committee. Mr Greenburgh:-
 - is a solicitor and partner with Wragge Lawrence Graham & Co., an international law firm based in Holborn
 - is head of the Public Sector Group (Local and Central Government, education, social housing and social care)
 - specialises in Local Government, conduct, probity and governance issues, employment and equalities law
 - previously served as a local authority councillor (Buckinghamshire County Council) between 1993 and 2001 and was Leader of the Council between 1997 and 2001
 - is a Freeman of the City and Liveryman of the City of London Solicitors' Company.
- 7. **Mr Dan Large** has not previously served as a Co-opted Member of the Standards Committee. Mr Large:-
 - is a Company Director and Trustee of the Riverside Trust Limited
 - is a Council Member of the Chartered Institute of Public relations
 - is a member of the Professional Practices Committee, Chartered Institute of Public Relations
 - is a Freeman of the Company of Public Relations Practitioners
 - has served on a variety of standards-focussed committees over recent years, including the Disciplinary Appeals Panel of the University of Newcastle upon Tyne, the Independent Monitoring Board of HMP Wormwood Scrubs, and the Professional Practices Committee of the Chartered Institute of Public Relations
 - has worked regularly with local authorities and the Department for Communities & Local Government in his professional capacity as a political adviser.
- 8. We are pleased to endorse the Selection Panel's **recommendation** that both Mr Mark Greenburgh and Mr Dan Large be appointed to serve on the Standards Committee as Co-opted Members for a four-year term expiring in December 2018.

All of which we submit to the judgement of this Honourable Court.

Report of the Education Board

Appointment of Governors to City Academy Hackney, City of London Academy Southwark, and Prior Weston Primary School

To be presented on Thursday, 11th September 2014

To the Right Honourable The Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled.

Summary

The City of London Corporation holds responsibility for the appointment of a number of Governors to the several City Academies, as well as a number of other schools and educational institutions. Your Education Board has recently considered a number of vacancies and accordingly recommends that the Court of Common Council grants approval to appoint Nigel Challis CC to the Board of Governors of the City Academy Hackney, Mr Simon Atkinson to the Board of Governors of City of London Academy Southwark and Jeremy Mayhew CC to the Board of Governors of Prior Weston Primary School.

Recommendation

We **recommend** that:

- Nigel Challis CC be appointed to the Board of Governors of City Academy Hackney
- Mr Simon Atkinson be appointed to the Board of Governors of City of London Academy Southwark
- Jeremy Mayhew CC be appointed to the Board of Governors of Prior Weston Primary School

MAIN REPORT

Background

- 1. The Education Board was brought into being at the meeting of the Court of Common Council on 1st May 2014, where it was granted a remit to oversee the City of London Corporation's education portfolio and the implementation of the City of London Education Strategy 2013-2015.
- 2. Part of the Education Board's remit is to be responsible for the oversight and monitoring of the City of London's sponsorship of its Academies, including recommending to the Court of Common Council the appointment of Governors. Similarly, the Education Board is responsible for recommending to the Court of Common Council candidates for appointment as the City of London Corporation's representative on school governing bodies where nomination rights are granted, and which do not fall within the remit of any other committee.

Current position

- 3. At its meeting on 24th June 2014 the Education Board noted that Nigel Challis CC had been performing, with the approval of the Community and Children's Services Committee, the role of Governor at City Academy Hackney on an interim basis from November 2013, due to an unforeseen vacancy having arisen. Moreover, the Education Board noted that this interim arrangement had proved a success, with both the co-sponsor KPMG and the wider Board of Governors being keen to have Mr Challis appointed to a full term as Governor. Therefore the Education Board resolved to recommend Mr Challis' appointment to the Court of Common Council for approval.
- 4. The Education Board went on to consider the proposed appointment of Mr Simon Atkinson as City-appointee to the Board of Governors of the City of London Academy Southwark, noting his role as Assistant Chief Executive of Ipsos MORI and 20 years of experience in both the public and private sectors. On the basis of his supporting statement the Education Board therefore resolved to recommend Mr Atkinson's appointment to the Court of Common Council for approval.
- 5. The Education Board then noted that an opportunity had arisen for the City of London Corporation to appoint a community Governor to the Board of Governors of Prior Weston Primary School in Islington. Two-thirds of City children who attend maintained schools are educated at Prior Weston, and the school is currently rated 'Good' by Ofsted. Members agreed that a City Governor would ideally be able to support the school's ability to take advantage of its close proximity to the City and to enable the school to match the achievements of its counterpart in the City, Sir John Cass Primary School.
- 6. An application process was conducted and Jeremy Mayhew CC was identified as a suitable candidate by the Town Clerk under delegated authority, in consultation with the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Education Board. The Town

Clerk therefore recommends to the Court of Common Council Mr Mayhew's appointment to the Board of Governors of Prior Weston Primary School.

Conclusion

7. This report accordingly **recommends** the appointment of Nigel Challis CC, Mr Simon Atkinson and Jeremy Mayhew CC to, respectively, the Board of Governors of City Academy Hackney, City of London Academy Southwark and Prior Weston Primary School.

All of which we submit to the judgement of this Honourable Court.
