# 5. GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION - IMPACT FOR THE CITY OF LONDON SCHOOL FOR GIRLS

- The Headmistress informed the Governors that the School did not make many referrals the City's Designated Officer because most girls at the School did not live in the City of London and concerns were therefore reported to their local Councils. Nevertheless, the Headmistress emphasised that the School did have a close and effective working relationship with the City's Designated Officer.
- A Governor commented that the School should take a 'over reporting better than under reporting' approach regarding safeguarding referrals.

# 8. ANY OTHER BUSINESS THAT THE CHAIRMAN CONSIDERS URGENT Appointment of Co-Opted Governor – Soha Gawaly

Governors considered a tabled *curriculum vitae* of a potential candidate for coopted Governor, Soha Gawaly. The Headmistress and Chairman endorsed Ms Gawaly and commented that she was previous parent of a girl at the School, Chairman of the Friends of the City of London School for Girls Committee, and in that role had demonstrated a firm grasp of the strategic needs of the School. In her view Ms Gawaly also brought significant fundraising expertise to the Board, which would contribute to the development of the School's overall fundraising strategy.

**RESOLVED**, that Soha Gawaly be appointed as a co-opted Governor for a term ending December 2020.

### **Notice of Resignation as Co-Opted Governor – Mary Robey**

The Chairman noted that Mary Robey had given notice that she would be standing down from the Board at Easter 2018. The Chairman gave thanks to Ms Robey for her tremendous contribution to the work of the Board and noted that she had made a huge difference to the School during her time on the Board. Ms Robey was heard in reply.

### Retirement of Co-Opted Governor - Professor John Betteridge

The Chairman noted that Professor Betteridge, whose term on the Board ended in December 2017, had given notice of his intention not to seek another term as co-opted Governor due to ill health. Governors joined the Chairman in noting their thanks to Professor Betteridge for his longstanding service to the Board and wished him well in his retirement. The Chairman noted that she would be writing to Professor Betteridge to that effect.

### **Desired Skills of Future Co-Opted Governors**

A Governor commented that when considering appointments to the co-opted Governor vacancies on the Board, previous students of the School should be considered particularly if they could be considered leaders in their chosen profession. The Chairman noted that in light of Ms Robey's resignation, an educationalist would also be considered as priority. A Governor concluded discussion by noting that a candidate with proven expertise in project management and/or architecture would be of benefit to the Board given the School's expansion plans.

### **New Common Council Governor – Rehana Ameer**

The Chairman noted that Rehana Ameer had been appointed as Common Council Governor to the Board by the City's Court of Common Council. At the Chairman's request, the Town Clerk agreed to circulate Ms Ameer's *curriculum vitae* to the Board and agreed further to circulate the *curriculum vitae* of any future Governors when they joined the Board.
