LICENSING (HEARING) SUB COMMITTEE PROCEDURE FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS

- 1. This procedure shall apply to all public hearings conducted under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2. Public hearings conducted under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 shall take the form of a discussion led by the licensing authority. Cross-examination will be permitted when the Sub Committee considers it to be required. The conduct of hearings shall be broadly based, subject to the discretion of the Sub Committee, on the points set out below.
- 3. At the start of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub Committee will introduce him/herself and other Members of the Sub Committee as well as the City Corporation officers present. Anyone making representations will then be asked to introduce themselves and anyone accompanying them. The applicant will then do likewise.¹
- 4. The Chairman will then explain the purpose of the hearing and the procedure to be followed at the hearing. The Sub Committee will then make any rulings necessary in respect of requests for witnesses to be heard in support of any of the parties making representations or the applicant.
- 5. Those making representations will then be invited to present their case. Repetition will not be permitted. Equal time will be offered to the applicant and those making representations. Where there is more than one party making representations and/or calling witnesses in support, consideration should be given to having one spokesman on behalf of all parties so as to avoid repetition. Although the use of a spokesman will be encouraged by the Sub Committee, the decision rests with those parties making representations.
- 6. In the event of disorder or persistent disregard of the authority of the Chair, the Chairman may suspend or adjourn the hearing, or require that the person(s) causing disorder or showing disregard leave the hearing.
- 7. In the event that the Sub Committee has decided that cross-examination will be permitted, the applicant will be invited to ask questions of the party(s) making representations and their witnesses (if any). The party(s) making representations and any witnesses giving evidence in support will then answer any questions put to them by members of the Sub Committee.
- 8. The applicant will then be invited to present their case and call any witnesses in support of their application. The applicant will be entitled to the same period of time to present his case as those making representations were afforded.

¹ In hearings where a licence is being reviewed, references in this procedure to 'applicant' should be read as references to the licence holder and references to 'those making representations' should be read as references to those applying for the review.

- 9. In the event that the Sub Committee has decided that cross-examination will be permitted, those making representations will be invited to ask questions of the applicant and their witnesses (if any). The applicant and any witnesses giving evidence in support will then answer any questions put to them by members of the Sub Committee.
- 10. The Chairman will ask all parties if there is anything else they would like to add in support of their respective cases.
- 11. Those making representations will then be invited to make closing submissions followed by the applicant.
- 12. The Sub Committee will then retire to consider their decision. They may call for assistance by the representatives of the Town Clerk and/or the Comptroller & City Solicitor but those persons will play no part in the decision-making process.
- 13. In due course, the Sub Committee will return to announce their decision or to inform those present when the decision will be given.

1 Introduction and Purpose

- 1.1 The purpose of this meeting of the Sub-Committee is to consider and determine, by public hearing, an application for the grant of a premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, taking into consideration the representations of nine *other persons* detailed in paragraphs 5, together with the *policy considerations* detailed in paragraph 6 of this report.
- 1.2 The decision of the Sub-Committee must be made with a view to promoting one or more of the four licensing objectives, namely:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance
 - the protection of children from harm

2 Summary of Application

2.1 An application made by:

Kuash Ltd

100-102 Judd Street

London WC1H 9NT

was received by the City of London licensing authority on 11th December 2018 for the grant of a premises licence in respect of the premises:

Half Cup Unit 9 22-23 Bartholomew Close London EC1A 7BB

- 2.2 Full details of the application can be seen as Appendix 1
- 2.3 The application seeks permission for the sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises as shown in the following table:

- 2.4 The operating schedule submitted with the application suggests steps intended to be taken in order to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives. Conditions consistent with this schedule which (modified as appropriate) could be included as conditions on the premises licence are attached as Appendix 2.
- 3 Licensing History of Premises
- 3.1 This is a newly built premises with no licensing history.
- 4 Representations from Responsible Authorities
- 4.1 No representations have been received from any responsible authority.

5 Representations from Other Persons

- 5.1 There have been nine representations against this application from members of the public. These representations are attached as Appendix 3 (i-ix).
- 5.2 The representations all maintain that granting the application would undermine the licensing objective of *the prevention of public nuisance*. (It will be noted that several representations include adverse references to the proposed provision of tables and chairs at the premises. A tables and chairs licence application has been received by the licensing office and will be determined under delegated authority).

6 Policy Considerations

6.1 In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must have regard to its statement of licensing policy and any statutory guidance issued under s 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

City of London Corporation's Statement of Licensing Policy

- 6.2 The following pages/sections/paragraphs of the City of London Corporation's Statement of Licensing Policy are particularly applicable to this application.
- 6.3 Pages 14-16 address the licensing objective 'The prevention of crime and disorder' and pages 19-22 address the licensing objective 'The prevention of public nuisance'.

The boxed comment on page 19 states the need to strike a fair balance between the benefits to a community of a licensed venue, and the risk of disturbance to local residents and workers.

The boxed comment on page 19 also states an overriding policy principle namely, that each application will be decided on its individual merits.

Paragraphs 79 - 81 address the need of care when controlling noise particularly from those persons leaving a premises.

The boxed comment on page 22 considers various factors that should be taken into account when considering whether any licensable activity should be permitted.

Paragraphs 115-121 state the City of London Corporation's policy on setting conditions which may be applicable dependant on the step(s) taken by members as stated in paragraph nine of this report.

Statutory Guidance

The following sections/paragraphs of the statutory guidance issued under S182 of the Licensing Act 2003 are particularly applicable to this application (revised April 2018):

Chapter 2 of the guidance covers the four licensing objectives. In particular, paragraph 2.15 states that it is, '...important that in considering the promotion of [the public nuisance licensing objective, licensing authorities] focus on the effect of the licensable activities at the specific premises on persons living and working (including those carrying on business) in the area around the premises which may be disproportionate and unreasonable.' Also, paragraph 2.16 indicates that the prevention of public nuisance could, in appropriate circumstances include, 'the reduction of the living and working amenity and environment of other persons living and working in the area of the licensed premises.'

Chapter 10 refers to conditions attached to premises licences with paragraph 10.10 stating that, 'Conditions should be determined on a case-by-case basis and standardised conditions which ignore these individual aspects should be avoided.' To which is added; 'Licensing authorities should therefore ensure that any conditions they impose are only those which are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.'

7 Map and Plans

7.1 A map showing the location of the premises together with nearby licensed premises is attached as Appendix 4. A key to those premises is

included which indicates the maximum respective permitted hours for alcohol sales.

7.2 A plan of the premises can be seen as Appendix 5.

8 Public Notices

- 8.1 The statutory blue public notice was duly exhibited at the premises as evidenced by photographs taken on 8/12/18. Three photographs of the notice in-situ are attached as Appendix 6 (a-c)
- 8.2 A copy of the statutory newspaper advertisement in the Islington Tribune is attached as Appendix 7.

9 Summary

9.1 The Licensing Authority has a duty under the Licensing Act 2003 to promote the licensing objectives. Each objective has equal importance. In carrying out its licensing functions, the licensing authority must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy, any statutory guidance under the Licensing Act 2003 and is bound by the Human Rights Act 1998. The City of London Corporation must also fulfil its obligations under section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in the City.

10 Options

- 10.1 The Sub-committee must, having regard to the above-mentioned representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate and necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) grant the application in the manner for which it was applied; or
 - ii) reject the application in whole or in part.

9.2 The applicant and/or the persons making representations may appeal the decision of the Sub-Committee by notification to the Magistrates Court within twenty-one days of receiving formal notification of the decision.

11 Recommendation

11.1 It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Sub-Committee determine this application for the grant of a premises licence in accordance with paragraph 9 of this report.

Supply of alcohol off the premises shall be limited to service of alcohol to persons seated at tables and chairs outside the premises and authorised for such use by the City of London.

Supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall cease at 21.00 every night

Supplies of alcohol shall be waiter/waitress service to patrons seated at tables or at the service counter,

Substantial food shall be available at all times that the premises are trading

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises will install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras will continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings will be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be present at all times when they are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested.

There will be no promoted events, where a promoted event means an event involving music and/or dancing where the musical entertainment is provided at any time by a DJ or DJs, one or some of whom are not employees of the premises licence holder and the event is promoted to the general public.

All appropriate steps will be taken to ensure that local residents and local businesses are not disturbed by any licensable activity at the premises.

- 1) The supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be limited to the service of alcoholic drinks to persons seated at tables outside the premises authorised for such use by the City of London Corporation.
- 2) The supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall cease at 21:00 hours each night.
- 3) The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress to patrons seated at tables or at the service counter.
- 4) The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment, will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. We write with respect to the planning application for Unit 9 at 22 /23, Bartholomew Close, EC1A 7BB.

As a general first comment we feel that objecting in principle to further restaurant and licensed premises in the regenerated area of Bartholomew close is futlle as the premises were long ago designated for the proposed purposes within the overall planning scheme without any proper informed or democratic consultation regarding the effect that such premises would have on the regenerated area.

Nevertheless we do feel that if applications continue at this rate the area will be saturated with eating establishments which in turn will lead to an acceleration of cultural change within the once peaceful residential area. Can the Committee moderate this proliferation? A start would be to refuse this application.

We have previously objected to the use of pavement tables and the same objections regarding the cluttering of pavement areas etc. apply in this instance.

Previously we have noted that one former applicant was to move pavement tables inside the premises at close of business each day. We ask that this stipulation be extended to the current and all previous applications if pavement tables are agreed?

The hours of business are from 9 am to 10:30 pm seven days a week. We consider this excessive and would ask that Sunday at least should be day on which the premises are closed. City workers are not in the area on Saturday or Sunday so this should not be too much of a commercial difficulty.

We would also ask that for all such premises in Bartholomew Close, the hours of business are consistent in terms of the closing times to limit going home noise and crowding.

A third licensing request has come up for outside seating in Bartholomew Close EC1A after Lino and Stem&Glory. The same response applies to all: as a local resident in what has been a very quiet location there is a worry about noise nuisance. This can be mitigated by:

1 keeping the permitted hours within a reasonable time so there is no disturbance in setting up early (not before 8aml) or packing up late (not after 10pm). This is to include staff time in setting up and clearing away, not just the hours that diners may use the tables.

For local people this disturbance is very unpleasant as it is all the time, not just for an exceptional event 2. Reducing noise by Insisting on wooden furniture which lessens the noise of scraping on pavements, and banging of cutlery and crockery on metal or glass tables 3. Making a licence conditional on scrupulous management in keeping down the noise of diners and relocating any with raised voices to inside tables, as well as keeping restaurant doors closed and ensuring no music is audible outside the premises These points could help,in maintaining a nice environment for everyone - customers and those living nearby (who may also welcome an opportunity to sit outside at times!) 
