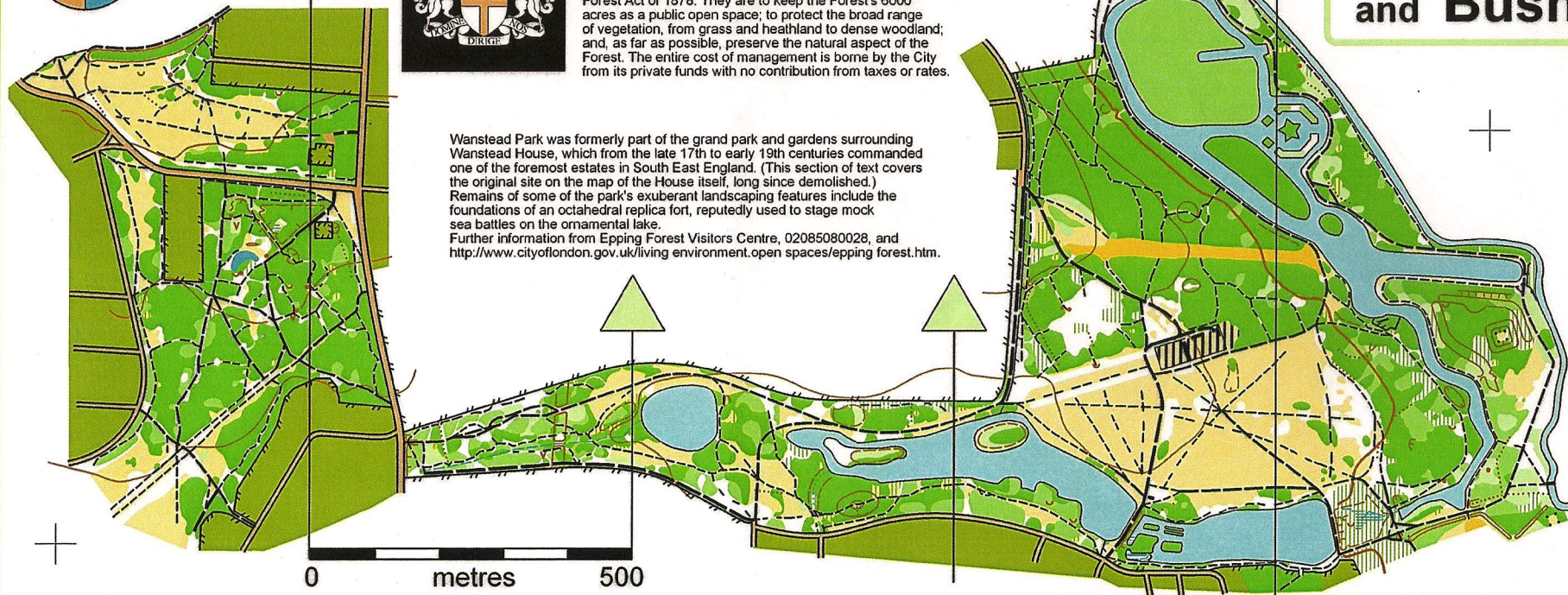




Chigwell and Epping Forest Orienteering Club would like to acknowledge the continued support of the Superintendent of Epping Forest and his staff. Wanstead Park and Bush Wood are part of Epping Forest, which is owned and managed by the City of London, who were constituted the Forest's Conservators by the Epping Forest Act of 1878. They are to keep the Forest's 6000 acres as a public open space; to protect the broad range of vegetation, from grass and heathland to dense woodland; and, as far as possible, preserve the natural aspect of the Forest. The entire cost of management is borne by the City from its private funds with no contribution from taxes or rates.

Wanstead Park was formerly part of the grand park and gardens surrounding Wanstead House, which from the late 17th to early 19th centuries commanded one of the foremost estates in South East England. (This section of text covers the original site on the map of the House itself, long since demolished.) Remains of some of the park's exuberant landscaping features include the foundations of an octahedral replica fort, reputedly used to stage mock sea battles on the ornamental lake. 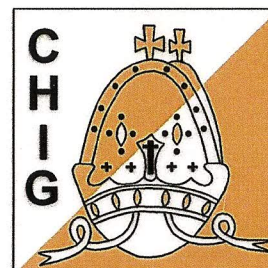

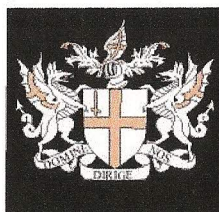
Many minor paths are not shown, especially on open land, where they are liable to change. Much vegetation is seasonal. Ditches and earthwalls beside roads are generally not shown.

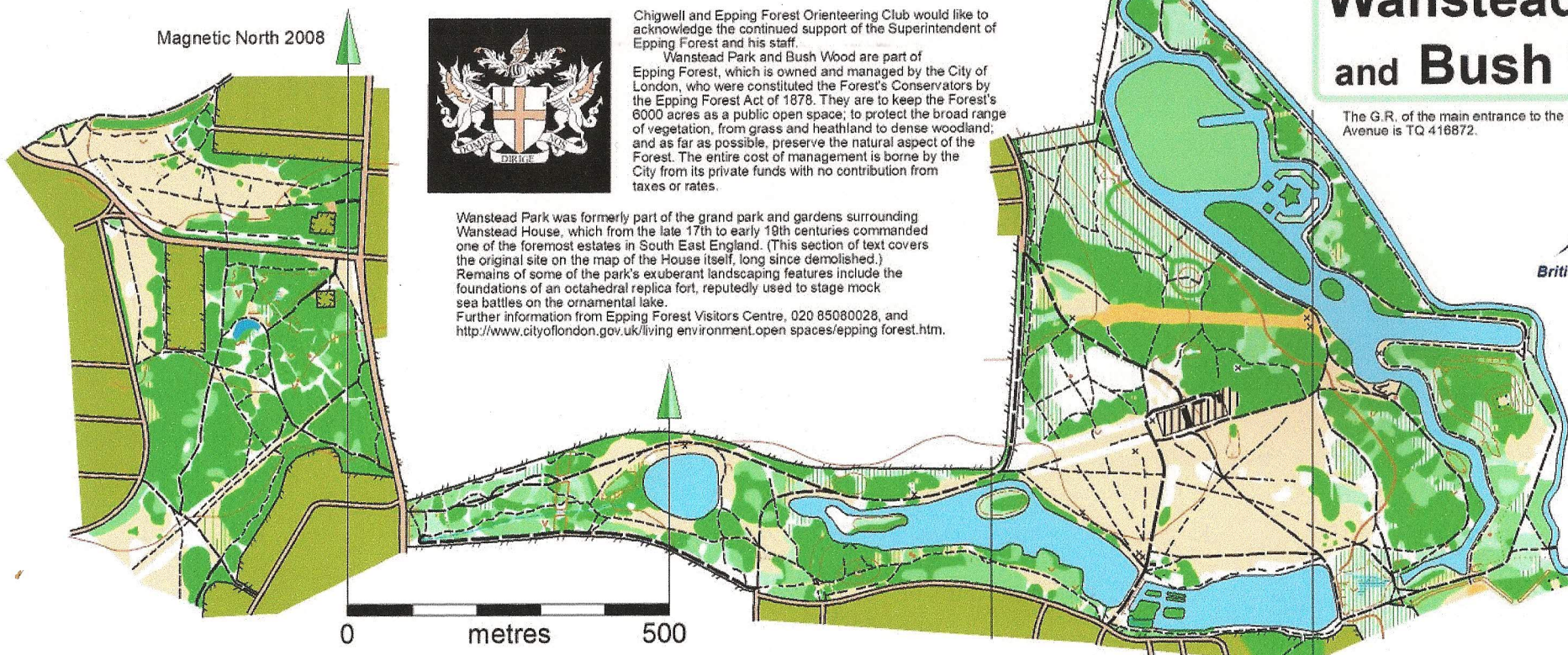

The G.R. of the main entrance to the Park from Northumberland Avenue is TQ 416872.



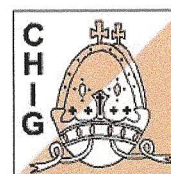
