A new, local environmental monitoring process and hardware has been invested in from local risk, allowing us to more accurately monitor the environmental conditions within the internal rooms and individual display cases. Keats House have an established relationship and regular meetings with City Surveyors team, fostering an improved understanding of the maintenance needs of these Grade I and II listed properties. Remote access to CCTV has been enabled by IT to enable officers to investigate intruder alarm activations prior to escalating. Donors being kept informed and liaison with internal partners (i.e. LMA) to ensure risks to collections are managed in short and medium to long term. CCTV system at Ten Keats Grove has been reinstated including works to reconnect two non-operational cameras prior to reopening the property (work took place w/c 15 June). Renewal / enhancement of CCTV requirement for Keats House raised with City Surveyors.  This risk has been moved to green (previously amber) in light of the CCTV works which have taken place.
