Cause: 1) Re-opening services where social distancing is difficult or impossible to enforce, such as (but not limited to) public toilets, the Parliament Hill Lido, and the Hampstead Heath swimming ponds. 2) Government guidance advises the re-opening of facilities which are not yet considered COVID-19 safe by our local risk assessors. Event: 1) Social distancing is not observed, in contravention of government guidance; social distancing measures are actively disobeyed, resulting in antisocial behaviour and the need for enforcement actions. 2) Facility opening is delayed past the date at which government guidance changes. Impact: 1) Staff members become sick; reputational damage; damage to properties; cessation of services that cannot be safely operated. 2) Reputational impact; antisocial behaviour & break-ins, and the requisite health & safety impact of this behaviour.	Impact	The Open Spaces Department is preparing to reopen several of its services at present, including toilets and swimming facilities. While appropriate social distancing measures and cleaning regimes are being prepared, staff resource is under significant pressure, and enforcement may need to be self-policed. The implementation of social distancing measures at the Lido and the Swimming Ponds during summer is likely to result in community backlash, both in terms of reputational damage and antisocial behaviour on the ground. Additionally, guidance is changing at a speed which some facilities are not able to accommodate, which may result in facilities remaining closed after the date for re-opening set by the government. If this occurs, we expect to see an increase in break-ins and antisocial behaviour, as well as a reputational impact. There has already been an uptick in unsanctioned swimming at Hampstead Heath, which presents a significant H&S and enforcement issue.
