Monday 21.5.12	03:55	<p><u>Two males stabbed</u></p> <p>At a promoted event held at the venue a number of scuffles broke out inside the Dollhouse and fighting continued outside the premises. Two males received stab wounds with one being stabbed in the groin and other stabbed in the leg. Police only became aware of the incident some 4 hours later when contacted by staff of an A&E department where the males arrived for treatment. Officers attended the hospital where they were informed it occurred at the Dollhouse but the victims refused to co-operate any further with the police.</p> <p>Police enquires also put the males' vehicles found at the hospital at the Dollhouse around the time the incident occurred. A vehicle was seen to mount the pavement in an attempt to run people over involved in the disorder. A motorcycle helmet was thrown at a moving vehicle which bounced off the windscreen and into the crowds of people. One person received injuries including substantial lacerations to her face from a bottle thrown during the melee.</p> <p>One officer describes the scene as Violent, Intimidating and Horrifying. Despite several requests to the Dollhouse management for CCTV, they never provided any.</p>		operator)
Saturday, 8.9.12	22:00	<p><u>Misleading high profile event with potential for public disorder</u></p> <p>The management of the Dollhouse had advertised on various website 'The official Lady Gaga after party' for Saturday 8th September 2012. Inspector JONES from the police licensing team had cause to contact owner Rob WRIGHT in respect to this promotion. The following day there was due to be a number of early morning road closures to facilitate some Paralympic events taking place in the City. The Lady Gaga event had</p>	w.s Insp. JONES

	<p>been advertised to thousands of people including Twitter references to the event being advertised on national radio. Given the large following of the star and the unprecedented attraction, the police were rightly concerned with policing such a high profile event the night before a major sporting event which would be beamed around the world. WRIGHT and WILCOX did not accept the police concerns and were difficult to deal with. Police then contacted Lady Gaga's tour agents who confirmed that they did not know anything about the party and she was definitely not attending. This then raised further concerns for the police that thousands of people would attend and could possibly turn hostile and violent if they found out they had been misled by the venue. The management of the venue initially refused police requests to publicise that Lady Gaga would not be attending. Superintendent LAWES then paid a visit to the premise and warned the venue management that if they did not take steps to prevent potential disorder at the event, he would apply to the court for a closure order. It was only after his intervention that the manager WRIGHT agreed to notify their followers on Twitter and other media</p>

Sunday, 9.9.12	02:06	<u>Drunk and disorderly.</u> A drunk customer was ejected from inside The Dollhouse. He then approached an Asian male and threw him on to the floor and then ran away from police. The suspect later said it was a friend of his who had been ejected and he followed suit. He had consumed one vodka and orange at home before consuming “3-4 more vodka and oranges, 1 Sambuca and a few Jagerbombs” at The Dollhouse. Monday, 10.12.12	04:10	<u>Public disorder and obstructing a police officer.</u> A disturbance outside The Dollhouse involving 10-15 males. CCTV operator notes that the crowd is not dispersing. Two police dog handlers try to disperse the crowd who are aggressive and threatening. One female refused to disperse and was abusive to police and was arrested for obstructing a police officer. <p>Saturday, 22.12.12</p>	<p>03:25</p>	<p><u>Cocaine use by promoter/customers – inadequate searching and fire safety hazards</u></p> <p>A covert visit by officers to the Dollhouse reveals inadequate searching at the door and persons including a member of the promoter's front of house team is seen taking cocaine in the toilet. The male was then pointed out to police officers outside The Dollhouse, where he is searched and found to be in possession of a wrap of cocaine. The covert officer also describes behaviour in the toilets which would suggest the consumptions of drugs.</p> <p>On entry to the venue the officer reports being subject to a brief search which is described as a 'token gesture, lasting 5-6 seconds'.</p> <p>The officer also reports the reckless use of flares attached to alcoholic beverages with the flares appearing to catch the ceiling and cause intense heat inside the venue.</p>	<p>([REDACTED]) w.s Covert Officer</p>	<p>NO (discovered by police)</p>

Police entered the venue and arrested the suspect who was found in possession of a small kitchen knife which he had concealed in his jeans. She was “extremely intoxicated”, fell over several times, was swearing and thrashing her arms out at officers. Police records suggest she had been drinking inside The Dollhouse. Monday morning 4.2.13	04:20	<p><u>Several males fighting at location/Firearms.</u></p> <p>Call from staff at venue requiring police assistance to deal with the dispersal of their customers. On arrival the males involved had already left however there was blood seen on the floor of the area. Police had to oversee the dispersal.</p> <p>Intelligence report that 3 occupants of a black Ford Focus attend Dollhouse. Sunday morning 24.3.13	04:01	<p><u>Late reporting of an assault at the venue</u></p> <p>The manger Rob Wright called Bishopsgate police station to report that <u>half an hour ago</u>, a male had been assaulted inside the venue. The victim had now left the scene as had all the suspects involved. Monday, 22.4.13	04:50	<p><u>Assault and failure of door staff to assist police.</u></p> <p>A female and her male ex-partner met at The Dollhouse. When they came out the club the male assaulted the female by slapping her across the face and kicking her in the stomach until she was unconscious. In a 999 call to police at 04:50 a member of the public describes seeing a group of 7-8 males and females leaving a club just before the male assaults the female. The males are having a “big fight”. One male was seen to take his top off. Security were trying to calm them down.</p> <p>Two door staff of The Dollhouse had witnessed the assault and knew the suspect but neither was prepared to give a witness statement to police as they “<i>fear repercussions</i>” if they provide evidence.</p> <p>The female victim was taken to hospital. Saturday, 4.5.13	23:30	<u>Assault by door staff/drunkenness.</u> <u>Failures of management to supply CCTV footage.</u> A drunk female was pushed over by a member of door staff after she left The Dollhouse or was ejected. This was confirmed by police who viewed CCTV footage outside the entrance to the club. The venue stated the female has been removed from the club because of her behaviour and fell over outside. The female later refused to co-operate with the police investigation. During the police investigation the venue's internal CCTV system was found to be faulty and no footage could be supplied to police.		NO, reported via MET police.
Sunday, 19.5.13	02:05	<u>Drunk and disorderly.</u> Police attended The Dollhouse after a drunk male was ejected and was arguing with door staff. The male was shouting and lunging towards other persons present and grabbed an officer's arm. The male later accepted a Fixed Penalty Notice.		Yes

Sunday 19.5.13	03:21	<u>Report of 9 females fighting.</u> Police attended a report of 9 females fighting outside the Dollhouse. They were called by the head of security of the venue. On arrival the females had been separated and some order had been restored, none of the people involved wanted to make any allegations of assault.	[REDACTED]	Yes
Monday, 3.6.13	03:30	<u>Assault.</u> A male argues with and then assaults a transgender female after they left The Dollhouse. The suspect was calling the victim a “Batty Boy”. Police intervened. 		<p>groups of females fighting for a number of minutes before any intervention by security of the venue. Even then neither management nor the staff called the police.</p>		
<p>Sunday, 1.7.13</p>	<p>02:08</p>	<p><u>Assault. Failures of management to supply CCTV footage.</u></p> <p>A fight occurred inside The Dollhouse between two groups of females which spilled outside the venue. One of the females jumped towards another and hit her in the head several times and grabbed her around the neck. Police attended but the victim did not want to press any charges. She was upset that the door staff did not help her when she asked them to call police. Door staff later told police they were unaware of any incident of violence and believed the people involved “were just being loud”.</p> <p>Police requested CCTV from the venue and were told it could only be downloaded onto a USB stick. Numerous attempts were made to collect this from the manager. However the manager was never present when officers attended and he did not return any phone calls. 9.9.13		<p><u>Intoxication</u></p> <p>Female was heavily intoxicated after drinking in the Dollhouse. She received a head injury after falling over when leaving the premises.</p>	INTEL (URN [REDACTED])	
Sunday, 19.10.13	04:09	<p><u>Serious public disorder.</u></p> <p>Outside The Dollhouse witnessed by police officers. Large scale disorder following a promoted event. Officers report about 100 people had been ejected from the Dollhouse onto the streets. The police had to deploy dogs to drive back the hostile crowds and it took about 30 minutes to restore order and disperse the crowd from outside the venue and surrounding streets. Police report that the staff of the Dollhouse closed up and left them to deal with fall out of the hostile crowd without any effective dispersal in place. <p>Thursday 29/11/13</p>	<p>03:30</p>	<p><u>Serious large scale disorder/GBH and persons armed with baseball bats</u></p> <p>Police were notified of a public disorder incident outside The Dollhouse and involving its customers shortly before 03:30. There was extensive incidents of public disorder outside The Dollhouse in Bishopsgate Churchyard which spread onto New Broad Street and Old Broad Street. The public disorder spanned some 45 minutes. In total 6 arrests were made for various public disorder, assault and offensive weapon offences. However many more arrests would had been made if the police were not so outnumbered by the numbers of violent participants involved in the disorder. The scene was described by officers as “daunting” and “chaotic”. Several separate incidents could be identified involving between 10-20 males and females fighting. Fighting seemed to break out every few minutes. Some males took off their shirts to square up to each other. Many were clearly drunk although some appeared sober. Since the initial reporting of this incident a further victim has reported to the Metropolitan police. This may have been the trigger for the rest of the chaos that followed including a female seen on CCTV removing a baseball bat from the boot of a car and heading off to join in with the disorder. The investigating officer has made numerous unsuccessful attempts to contact Rob Wright at the Dollhouse in order to obtain the internal CCTV. (A request has now been made of Mr Bark, the solicitor acting for the licence holder in these review proceedings).</p>
