WRIGHT and WILCOX did not accept the police concerns and were difficult to deal with. Police then contacted Lady Gaga's tour agents who confirmed that they did not know anything about the party and she was definitely not attending. This then raised further concerns for the police that thousands of people would attend and could possibly turn hostile and violent if they found out they had been misled by the venue. The management of the venue initially refused police requests to publicise that Lady Gaga would not be attending. Superintendent LAWES then paid a visit to the premise and warned the venue management that if they did not take steps to prevent potential disorder at the event, he would apply to the court for a closure order. It was only after his intervention that the manager WRIGHT agreed to notify their followers on Twitter and other media
