#### **Violent Crime from Licensed Premises**

#### **Overview**

From the 7<sup>th</sup> January up to 7<sup>th</sup> April 2018, licensed premises within the City of London have accounted for 82 violent crimes. This report covers a period of 91 days, the previous report covered a 96 day period during which 66 violent crimes occurred. The crimes comprise a variety of offences:

**Grievous Bodily Harm -5 offences** 

**Actual Bodily Harm -38 offences** 

Common Assault - 26 offences

**Public Order -7 offences** 

**Sexual Assault -5 offences** 

Assault Police - 1 offence

37 of the offences occurred at 10 premises accounting for between 2 and 8 crimes each. 40% of violent crime during this period originates from these 10 premises.

#### **Promoted Events**

Of the 82 violent offences within this period 5 crimes occurred whilst a premises hosted a promoted event. During this period a total of 171 promoted events were held at City premises.

#### **Traffic Light Scheme - In Context**

Working from the 'Traffic Light Scheme- Top Premises Sheet', currently available, dated 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017 to 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 there are 7 premises listed as 'red':

- We have held a meeting with the General Manager and Area Manager for number 1 and have written to them advising action that the police desire in order to reduce incidents. We await a response.
- Number 2 on the list have engaged with police wholeheartedly taking very significant measures to reduce incidents which have proved effective.
- Number 3 met with police in January and gave assurances that effective measures would be implemented which has been the case with no further cause for concern. We remain vigilant.
- Number 4 remains a challenge. The crime is generally low level assaults resulting from excessive intoxication. Police met with area management recently and a further meeting is being arranged in order to achieve commitment towards improvement. The venue has suffered 8 violent crimes since 7<sup>th</sup> January this year.
- Number 5 does not concern police, at this time, with 2 violent crimes since 7<sup>th</sup> January.
- Number 6 is not regarded as a problem venue but is being monitored. One of the two violent crimes for this venue since 7<sup>th</sup> January was a sexual assault perpetrated by a

member of door staff no longer employed. This individual was arrested by the Police Licensing Team and subsequently charged with the offence.
