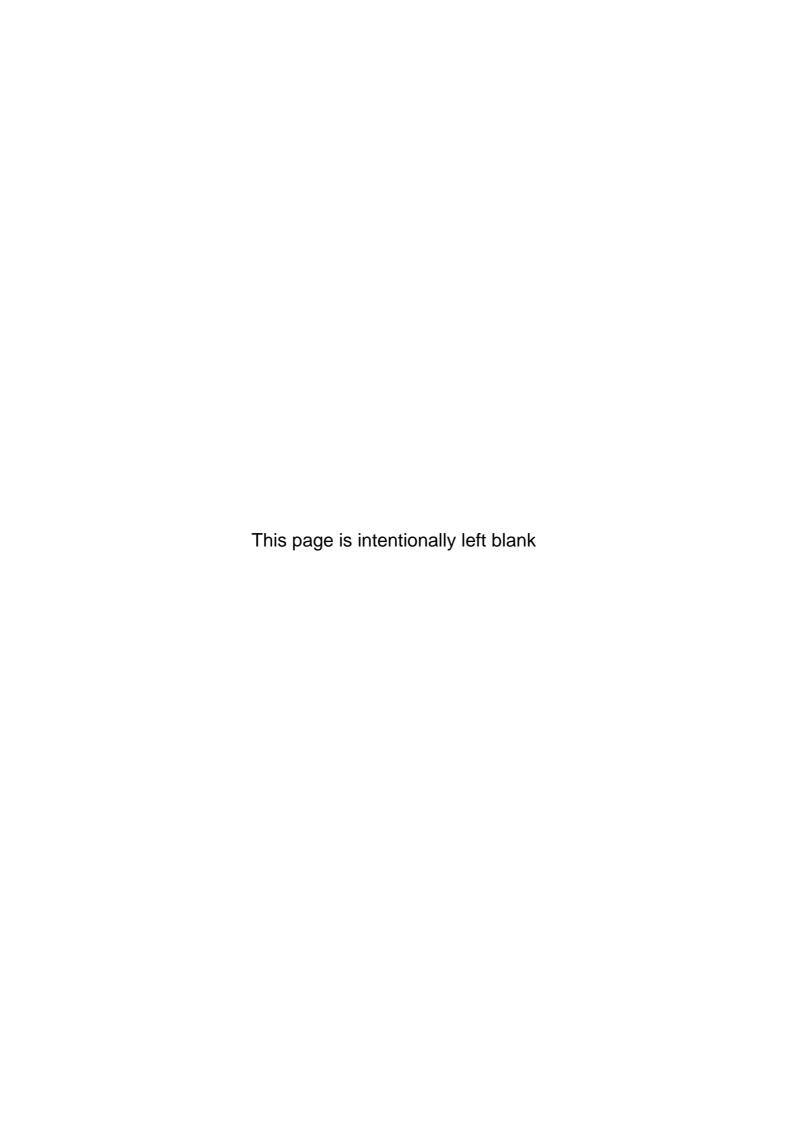

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LICENSING (HEARING) SUB COMMITTEE PROCEDURE FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS

- 1. This procedure shall apply to all public hearings conducted under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2. Public hearings conducted under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 shall take the form of a discussion led by the licensing authority. Cross-examination will be permitted when the Sub Committee considers it to be required. The conduct of hearings shall be broadly based, subject to the discretion of the Sub Committee, on the points set out below.
- 3. At the start of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub Committee will introduce him/herself and other Members of the Sub Committee as well as the City Corporation officers present. Anyone making representations will then be asked to introduce themselves and anyone accompanying them. The applicant will then do likewise.¹
- 4. The Chairman will then explain the purpose of the hearing and the procedure to be followed at the hearing. The Sub Committee will then make any rulings necessary in respect of requests for witnesses to be heard in support of any of the parties making representations or the applicant.
- 5. Those making representations will then be invited to present their case. Repetition will not be permitted. Equal time will be offered to the applicant and those making representations. Where there is more than one party making representations and/or calling witnesses in support, consideration should be given to having one spokesman on behalf of all parties so as to avoid repetition. Although the use of a spokesman will be encouraged by the Sub Committee, the decision rests with those parties making representations.
- 6. In the event of disorder or persistent disregard of the authority of the Chair, the Chairman may suspend or adjourn the hearing, or require that the person(s) causing disorder or showing disregard leave the hearing.
- 7. In the event that the Sub Committee has decided that cross-examination will be permitted, the applicant will be invited to ask questions of the party(s) making representations and their witnesses (if any). The party(s) making representations and any witnesses giving evidence in support will then answer any questions put to them by members of the Sub Committee.
- 8. The applicant will then be invited to present their case and call any witnesses in support of their application. The applicant will be entitled to the same period of time to present his case as those making representations were afforded.

¹ In hearings where a licence is being reviewed, references in this procedure to 'applicant' should be read as references to the licence holder and references to 'those making representations' should be read as references to those applying for the review.

- 9. In the event that the Sub Committee has decided that cross-examination will be permitted, those making representations will be invited to ask questions of the applicant and their witnesses (if any). The applicant and any witnesses giving evidence in support will then answer any questions put to them by members of the Sub Committee.
- 10. The Chairman will ask all parties if there is anything else they would like to add in support of their respective cases.
- 11. Those making representations will then be invited to make closing submissions followed by the applicant.
- 12. The Sub Committee will then retire to consider their decision. They may call for assistance by the representatives of the Town Clerk and/or the Comptroller & City Solicitor but those persons will play no part in the decision-making process.
- 13. In due course, the Sub Committee will return to announce their decision or to inform those present when the decision will be given.

1 Introduction

- 1.1 To consider and determine, by public hearing, the application to vary a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003, taking into account the representations of the responsible authorities detailed in paragraph 4, other persons detailed in paragraph 5 and the policy considerations detailed in paragraph 6 of this report.
- 1.2 The decision of the Sub-Committee must be made with a view to promoting one or more of the four licensing objectives, namely:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance
 - the protection of children from harm

2 **Summary of Application**

2.1 An application made by:

Charmed London Ltd Hillside Cottage Dudden Hill Lane NW10 1BJ was received by the City of London Licensing Authority on 25 March 2013 to vary a premises licence in respect of the premises:

Cos Bar 148 Queen Victoria Street EC4V 4BY

- 2.2 The application seeks to extend the times for which the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment can take place on a Friday and Saturday evening. In addition, the application seeks to add live music and anything of a similar description to recorded/live music which are currently not licensed. Finally, the application has brought the hours for recorded music in line with the other licensable activities; there are currently no restrictions for this activity.
- 2.3 The application seeks to extend the current terminal hour on Friday and Saturday from 01:00 to 03:00 as follows:

The Operating Schedule submitted by the applicant suggests no further steps are felt necessary in order to promote the four licensing objectives. However, an addition to the operating schedule was submitted as part of the application and can be found following Section P of the operating schedule. It is suggested that three further conditions are added and that nonstandard timings are dealt with in the future by way of Temporary Event Notices.

In addition to the mandatory conditions, other conditions attached to the premises licence are currently still valid and the application asks for them to be removed. The 'CCTV' condition would have to be replaced/removed if the proposed 'CCTV' condition was to be used. Conditions currently on the licence can be seen as Appendix 3 and the proposed conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule can be seen as Appendix 4.

- 2.4 The mandatory licence conditions can be found in the Licensing Act 2003, sections 19-21. Also, in the Schedule to The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010.
- 2.5 Full details of the application are contained in a copy of the Application Form at Appendix 1.

3 <u>Licensing History of Premises</u>

- 3.1 A premises licence was converted in June 2005 when the premises was known as 'Goose At The Castle'. The licence was transferred from Mitchells & Butlers to Charmed London Ltd in June 2006 when the name changed to 'Cos Bar'.
- 3.2 The current premise licence can be seen as Appendix 2.

4 Representations from Responsible Authorities

4.1 There have been no representations from responsible authorities.

5 Representations From Other Persons

5.1 Twenty-Two representations have been received from other persons. Ten were from Members, one of which was also making the representation in his capacity as a resident. The remaining twelve were all residents either living in St Andrews Hill, Carter Lane or Friar

Street. All representations are against the application to vary the premises licence either on the grounds of public nuisance or crime and disorder. The representations are attached in their entirety at Appendix 5.

6 Policy Considerations

6.1 In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must have regard to its Statement of Licensing policy and any statutory guidance issued under s 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

City of London Corporation's Statement of Licensing Policy

6.2 The following sections/paragraphs of the City of London Corporation's Statement of Licensing Policy are particularly applicable to this application.

Paragraph 29 states that in completing the operating schedule, applicants should set out in some detail how they intend to run the premises in order to promote the four licensing objectives.

Paragraph 50 states an overriding policy principle namely, that each application will be decided on its individual merits, with the process complying with the regulations made under the Licensing Act 2003.

Paragraphs 51-54 state the Corporation's policy on setting conditions which may be applicable dependant on the step(s) taken by members as stated in paragraph nine of this report.

Paragraphs 57-59 address the need to strike a fair balance between the desires and expectations of operators and the benefits to the community of licensed venues with the reasonable expectations of local residents and workers not to be disturbed during night time hours.

Paragraph 66 introduces a number of relevant matters to be considered by the City Corporation when assessing the likelihood of a particular licensable activity causing an unacceptable adverse impact, particularly on local residents and businesses. Paragraph 84 – It is the policy of the City Corporation to consider very carefully the implications of granting a licence when the hours sought extend into the early hours of the morning.

Statutory Guidance

6.3 The following sections/paragraphs of the statutory guidance issued under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003 are particularly applicable to this application (revised April 2012):

Chapter 2 of the guidance covers the four licensing objectives. In particular, paragraph 2.18 states that it is, '...important that in considering the promotion of [the public nuisance licensing objective, licensing authorities] focus on the effect of the licensable activities at the specific premises on persons living and working (including those carrying on business) in the area around the premises which may be disproportionate and unreasonable.' Also, paragraph 2.19 indicates that the prevention of public nuisance could, 'include low-level nuisance perhaps affecting a few people living locally.....'

Chapter 9, paragraphs 9.27 to 9.40, covers the determination of applications at a hearing. Of particular note is paragraph 9.39 which states, 'The *[licensing]* Authority's determination should be evidence based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve'.

Chapter 10 refers to conditions attached to premises licences with paragraph 10.10 stating that, 'Conditions should be determined on a case-by-case basis and standard conditions which ignore these individual aspects should be avoided.' Also, 'Licensing authorities should therefore ensure that any conditions they impose are only those which are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.'

7 Map and Plans

- 7.1 A map showing the location of the premises together with nearby licensed premises is attached at Appendix 6. A key of those premises is included which indicates the maximum permitted hours for alcohol sales in respect of each premises.
- 7.2 A current plan of the premises is attached as Appendix 7.

8 Summary

8.1 The Licensing Authority has a duty under the Licensing Act 2003 to promote the Licensing Objectives. Each objective has equal importance. In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy, any Statutory Guidance under the Licensing Act 2003 and is bound by the Human Rights Act 1998.

9 Options

- 9.1 The Sub-committee must, having regard to the representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - i) modify the conditions of the licence; or
 - ii) reject the whole or part of the application

Any determination by the licensing sub-committee will not have effect until the end of 21 days following notification of the decision to the applicant by the licensing authority or, in the event of an appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the Sub-Committee's decision, the determination of the appeal

10 Recommendation

10.1 It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Sub-Committee determine this application for a variation of a premises licence in accordance with paragraph 9 of this report.

LICENSING ACT 2003 - REPRESENTATION

I write as a resident of St Andrew's Hill, a block of flats which immediately abuts 148 Queen Victoria Street, to make a representation regarding the Premises Licence Holder's current application inter alia to extend its permissions for various activities including the sale of alcohol on Fridays and Saturdays to 03:00h on the following day.

Subject to the caveat below, I object to the application as I do not believe that it will promote the licensing objectives, in particular in relation to the prevention of public nuisance and crime and disorder. The reason for this belief is the proximity to residences and the conduct of the premises under its current licence. On Saturday/Sunday 16/17 February, I had cause to visit the premises to complain about the sound system being used that night by the organiser of a promoted event. I have received an assurance from the Premises Licence Holder, Ms Cantillon, that they would not in future permit the use of additional speakers, but consider that this may be insufficient to ensure that residents are not disturbed by late night entertainment, especially if live music were to be permitted.

I referred to a caveat, which relates to the equality impact of the application, to which the authority must have due regard under s149 of the Equality Act 2010. I am aware that the premises hosts an event for the LGBT community (known as 'Bijou', providing safe social space for lesbians and bisexual women) on the second Saturday of each month. As Chairman of the Licensing Authority and as the Local Government Association's lead member for equalities, I am aware that there are very few venues for people with that particular protected characteristic in the City and I would therefore be willing to see the premises have later opening hours on the second Saturday of each month to accommodate that event.

Finally however, on inspecting the outside of the premises, I noted that the notice required to be placed advertising this application was not in the statutory form (see attached photograph). I would therefore question the validity of the current application.

I am writing to you as I believe that the granting of an extension to the current licence is likely to have a negative effect on the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives. Therefore I wish to make the following representation regarding this application.

I believe that this application to extend the hours of operation, would seriously affect the lives of residents in my ward, who occupy flats towards the top of St.Andrew's Hill. The noise that will be generated from this bar well into the early hours of Saturday and Sunday mornings, combined with its relative proximity to residential properties in my ward and elsewhere, puts this application completely at odds with the Corporation's stated policy on licensing. Specifically:

(Sec. 39...) One of the greatest irritations to residents trying to sleep is the excessive noise escaping from licensed premises.

(Location of Premises, Licensing Hours and the Prevention of Nuisance, Sec.57...) Residents have a reasonable expectation that their sleep will not be unduly disturbed between the hours of 23.00 and 07:00. (Sec.58...) The risk of residents' sleep being disturbed by patrons leaving licensed premises is obviously greater at 02.00 than at 23.00. Residents have a reasonable expectation that their sleep will not be unduly disturbed between the hours of 23.00 and 07:00.

(Policy Sec.59...) It is therefore the policy of the City Corporation to strike a fair balance between the benefits to a community of a licensed venue, and the risk of disturbance to local residents and workers.

Should this application be approved, I believe that noise from the bar, and from people outside the bar, coming and going, and smoking, is highly likely to cause a 'public nuisance', and this will be explicitly at odds with the City of London Statement of Licensing Policy 2013, and would be 'unfair' to residents in my ward.

Dear Sir,

I am a recently elected member for Castle Baynard and I write to comment on the above application which is in my Ward.

I understand the following variations have been requested:

- To extend the permissions for live music (including DJs), anything of a similar description to live music, recorded music or dance, provision of facilities for dancing on Fridays and Saturdays to 03:00h (the following day).
- To extend the current permissions for the sale of alcohol on Fridays and Saturdays to 03:00h (the following day).
- To extend the current permissions for late night refreshment on Fridays and Saturdays to 03:00h (the following day).
- The opening hours of the premises is (sic) to be extended on Fridays and Saturdays until 03:30h (the following day). All other permissions/conditions are to remain in place as per the current licence, in particular (but not limited to) New Year's Eve.

The Cos Bar is in the immediate vicinity of 7 residential flats at 31 and 34 St. Andrews Hill as well as nearby St. Andrews House and residences at 36 and 36A St. Andrews Hill.

There are a number of other licensed premises in the immediate vicinity of these residences as well as the Cos Bar.

If the requested variations are granted the residents nearby will continually have their sleep disrupted as customers who have been drinking for many hours leave the premises and noisily make their way home at 3 a.m. in the morning.

No matter how well run an establishment is it is impossible for a licensee to control this.

Since the smoking ban was introduced customers who smoke congregate outside licensed premises and the Cos Bar is no exception to this trend. This will lead to continual noise from customers that cannot be attenuated by closed doors and windows.

It is likely that the operators are seeking these relaxations in the terms of their licence in order to stage events into the early hours. Experience elsewhere in the City has

shown that these events tend to attract people from other parts of London and that serious crime and nuisance are inevitable accompaniments.

If this application is granted, the police will inevitably receive many complaints from angry residents about disturbance which will waste their time and distract them from their important crime prevention duties.

Given the proximity of other bars and pubs, granting this application would set a precedent for other premises to gain similar variations in their licences as well. This has the potential to expand the scale and Intensity of the night life in the vicinity to a level which is completely incompatible with reasonable coexistence with the residences.

It would seem to be impossible to identify any conditions that could be imposed if the above variations were approved to prevent serious nuisance to the residents living nearby.

Because of these factors I am writing to register my strong objection to ALL of these variations being granted because of the nuisance that will be caused.

It would be totally unsuitable for a venue in such close proximity to a residential building to have extended hours until 3.00 am. In particular with regard to live music which includes DJs as noise reverberates, in particular bass beats, through walls and leaks into the street when people exit and enter the bar. It's usually very hard to regulate that doors should remain closed at all times in particular during the summer. Most importantly, the noise that's created by customers leaving licenced premises, who are more often than not very loud because of drink, is something which causes a great deal of public nuisance and general noise problems. And sometimes unfortunately anti-social behaviour. A very recent example are the problems experienced by residents in Carter Lane — it was clearly demonstrated that it's impossible to regulate what happens in the street once customers leave a licenced premises — the only way to ensure that noise problems are kept to a minimum is to keep the closing times to midnight. I would therefore strongly recommend that the hours are not extended given the location of the bar.

Licensing Application: Cos Bar, 148 Queen Victoria Street

I wish to object to the application for variation of the Cos Bar's existing premises licence. My objections follow discussions I have had with occupiers of business and residential properties in the vicinity of the premises.

The applicant seeks permission for the Cos Bar to open until 03:30 on Friday nights/Saturday mornings and until 03:30 on Saturday nights/Sunday mornings, with associated extensions until 03:00 on those nights for live and recorded music, facilities for dancing, DJs, the provision of late night refreshment (both indoors and outdoors) and the supply of alcohol for consumption (both on and off the premises).

The Cos Bar is in a mixed business/residential area at the junction of Queen Victoria Street and St. Andrew's Hill, with one house and many apartments nearby. A group of seven residential apartments at 31-34 St. Andrew's Hill immediately adjoins the Cos Bar, within the same block as the bar. There are five additional residential apartments at 36/36A St. Andrew's Hill and a house in residential occupation at 35 St. Andrew's Hill. St. Andrew's Hill is also overlooked, from ground level upwards, by many of the apartments of the King's Wardrobe. Late night patrons of the Cos Bar often congregate on St. Andrew's Hill outside the licensed premises and up St. Andrew's Hill. Many use St. Andrew's Hill as a convenient location to park their cars.

I have three primary causes of concern with this application: noise and vibration from within the premises, noise from outside the premises and noise created by the Cos Bar's patrons as they disburse from the premises. All three of these concerns relate to matters of public nuisance and I submit that a public nuisance would result if this application were (in whole or in part) to be approved and that that would be contrary to the statutory licensing objectives.

MUSIC & DJs

In common with many licenced premises, the amplified noise from DJs, together with the live and recorded music, blare out at considerable volume. The Cos Bar is the same as many other licenced premises in this respect. What makes a difference in this case is the proximity of local residents: the noise (and the vibration of bass frequencies) is very clearly audible, particularly in the immediately adjoining residential apartments at 31-34 St. Andrew's Hill, and most especially at night. This is far more noticeable, and annoying, when residents are trying to sleep. What may be a necessary compromise as part of City-living at 11 pm most certainly becomes unacceptable if it continues for four hours after that! There is a significant reduction in residential amenity if residents are unable to sleep in their own homes for hour after hour during the night because of the incessant thump of music vibrating throughout their flats. This application would, if granted, make such a nuisance permanent, every weekend. Furthermore, the noise nuisance created at night by music and DJs is exacerbated when the Cos Bar's doors are opened to allow patrons into and out of the premises. The requirement that smokers may not smoke within premises increases the frequency of opening the doors and thus creates an additional noise nuisance from the DJs and music playing inside the premises. This would not matter in a nonresidential area - in a mixed business/residential area such as St. Andrew's Hill, however, it has a serious effect on residents' lives.

NOISE OUTSIDE THE PREMISES

Since the "no-smoking" regulations were introduced it has become common to see smokers (and others) standing outside licensed premises, enjoying their night out. Especially if they are outside in some number, this can create a significant noise nuisance in itself from the "conversation" between the groups outside. Patrons outside the premises can become increasingly boisterous, and noisier, as the amount of alcohol they have consumed increases. The later it gets, the louder they become. Once again, in many cases, this causes no problems but in the middle of a mixed residential area such as St. Andrew's Hill, such behaviour becomes a real nuisance, especially if it continues far into the night. The applicant seeks to provide late refreshment outdoors until 03:00 and to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises until the same time. It is quite clear that such an arrangement would increase the number of patrons outside the premises and that it would therefore significantly increase the amount of noise generated from outside the premises over several hours very early in the morning, which would negatively impact upon many local residents. This will especially be the case during the warmer weather - the stuffiest nights when local residents may most wish to open their bedroom windows to "get some air" in the Summer will be exactly the nights that the noise nuisance generated by patrons outside the premises will be greatest.

DISBURSEMENT FROM THE PREMISES

Once patrons leave any licensed premises, there will often be some considerable noise generated, entirely beyond the control of the licensee. At reasonable hours and in non-residential areas, this may well be of no consequence. But when such behavior occurs extremely late into the night, and in areas where people are trying to sleep, such noise can amount to a public nuisance. Those patrons of the Cos Bar who park in St. Andrew's Hill, or who disburse from the premises via St. Andrew's Hill, can be boisterously noisy, they often slam their car doors, and they make noise as they attempt to negotiate an exit (very often by reversing to the end of the road) from the place they have parked. St Andrew's Hill has a barrier part-way up its length - cars parked on either side of that barrier have to reverse and/or manoeuvre in the narrow street in order to leave, creating further noise in an otherwise extremely quiet area. St. Andrew's Hill really is not a suitable location for premises to be granted a licence to stay open until 03:30.

KING'S WARDROBE

St Andrew's Hill not only contains residential properties, but is also directly fronted by the premises of the King's Wardrobe. The King's Wardrobe is, according to its website, "a prestigious apartments development situated in a tranquil and secluded courtyard behind St. Paul's Cathedral, just off Ludgate Hill". I understand that there are currently two apartments there which are effectively in permanent occupation with the remaining 67 apartments used for short to medium/long term stays. Unfortunately, of the 69 apartments in the King's Wardrobe, those on the East side of the courtyard include many with windows directly facing St. Andrew's Hill, including some apartments at ground level. Those ground level apartments' windows immediately front onto the pavement of St. Andrew's Hill. Even with the current closing hours of the Cos Bar, the residents of the street-facing apartments (especially those at ground level) complain about the noise generated by that bar's patrons. If weekend closing times of 03:30 were to be approved, the hours at which a significant noise nuisance would occur immediately outside their windows would be substantially more anti-social and would quite conceivably have a negative effect upon the "King's Wardrobe" business itself.

ACCURACY OF LOCATION PLAN ACCOMPANYING THIS APPLICATION

There is one final point that I would like to bring to the attention of Officers and of the Licensing sub-committee. This application contains two plans – one of the premises themselves and another showing the location of the premises in relation to neighbouring properties. Looking at the Licensing section of the City of London website, the plan showing the location of the applicant's premises in relation to neighbouring properties gives a very misleading impression of

the size, location and orientation of the premises which this application relates to. It may well be that this is an effect of the way in which the plan was copied, in black and white, onto the City of London website, and that the original plan correctly shows the extent of the premises concerned. From the plan as it appears on the Licensing section of the City of London website, the premises are shown to have a frontage onto St. Andrew's Hill which is only a third of the length of the frontage onto Queen Victoria Street. In fact, whilst the frontage onto Queen Victoria Street is correctly shown, the frontage of the site of these premises onto St. Andrew's Hill is approximately seven times greater than is shown on the plan - in reality, the St. Andrew's Hill frontage is almost three times greater than the Queen Victoria Street frontage. Thus, the premises are oriented North-South rather than (as the plan as it appears on the City of London website suggests) East-West. This is of fundamental importance in understanding how noise from the premises can have such an impact upon the neighbouring residential properties with which it shares a party wall. To assist in putting the two submitted plans into context (and to demonstrate the way that even relatively low-level noise from the premises transmits into the neighbouring properties) I am told that it is possible, from at least one of the residential apartments in 31-34 St. Andrew's Hill, clearly to hear the noise of the hand-driers which are located on the premises plan in the area marked "W.C." The wall of the premises' toilets is the party wall with the neighbouring residential properties. To avoid any misunderstanding, I should therefore be grateful if the true extent of the applicant's premises in relation to the neighbouring properties, and the correct length of the premises' frontage onto St. Andrew's Hill, were drawn by Officers to the attention of the Licensing Sub-Committee before determination of this application.

SUMMARY

In a mixed business/residential area there is a balance to be drawn between the interests of a business which wishes to extend its hours of operation into the middle of the night and the interests of local residents, visitors and other businesses upon whom such an extension has a significantly adverse effect. In this case I submit that any extension to the current limitations on the hours of operation of the Cos Bar's premises licence will significantly, unreasonably and disproportionately harm the interests of those in the premises surrounding the Cos Bar to the extent of creating a public nuisance, and I would therefore request that this application to vary the Cos Bar's existing premises licence be refused.

I write to object to the application to extend the Cos Bar trading hours to 3.00am on Friday and Saturday evenings, ie into the early hours of Saturday and Sunday mornings. Current trading hours are to 12.00 midnight. I am a Member of the Court of Common Council for Castle Baynard, the Ward within which these premises are located.

There are a number of residences close to the subject premises in St Andrew's Hill, including seven flats above Shaws Booksellers (a wine bar, despite its name) at 31/34 St Andrew's Hill, the Rectory at 35 St Andrew's Hill and four flats at 36 St Andrew's Hill. St Andrew-by-the-Wardrobe Church is nearby as are apartments at The Kings Wardrobe (for which a planning application has been made to change of use from short term serviced apartments to full time residential).

One of the occupiers of a flat at 31/34 St Andrew's Hill had cause to leave his flat and go and complain to the premises supervisor in the early hours of 16 February 2013 (a Sunday morning about one month before this application was submitted) when the DJ at a promoted event was playing music so loudly that the base line was shaking the whole block. The Cos Bar owner apologised and said that having learned of the effect on neighbours she would not allow additional loud speakers to be used again, but residents are understandably concerned. Residents are entitled to expect peace and quiet, so they can sleep, between 11.00 pm and 7.00am, as set out in paragraph 57 of the City's (amended) licensing policy. Paras 84 and 85 of the licensing policy are also directly relevant when considering this application.

There are other residential properties on the other side of St Andrew's Hill, in Farringdon Within Ward, which may also be affected by noise from the Cos Bar, which has entrances/exits on both Queen Victoria Street and St Andrew's Hill.

Carter Lane is nearby, at the top of St Andrew's Hill, where there are a number of licensed premises, some of which have caused local residents sufficient nuisance to apply for, and obtain, a review of their licences. If trading hours at the Cos Bar are extended to 3.00am then there is clearly a risk that patrons of licensed premises in Carter Lane will walk the short distance to the Cos Bar and, if inebriated, make noise on their way to continue drinking, causing disturbance and public nuisance to the nearby residents contrary to licensing objectives (i) and (iii), the prevention of crime and disorder (specifically here disorder) and the prevention of public nuisance. With or without patrons from Carter Lane establishments, the comings and goings (dispersal of patrons as mentioned in para 34 of the licensing policy) from licensed premises open until 3.00am creates a serious risk of public nuisance to nearby residents.

The requirement for smokers to leave the licensed premises (often temporarily) generates noise whilst they smoke and talk outside the premises. I refer you to paras 79 to 81 of the City's licensing policy. Such noise extending to 3.00 am is not an acceptable thing to impose on my residential constituents.

I am not aware that an acoustic report was submitted with the application (there appears to be no mention of one) as required by para 33 of the City's licensing policy.

I submit that in this case the balance between nearby residents and the premises owners, required to be struck by para 59 of the licensing policy, requires this extension to be refused, and I ask the licensing committee to refuse it.


