#### 4. TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Committee considered a report of Town Clerk on the Open Spaces and City Gardens Committee's Terms of Reference. The report explained that the Committee were required to review their Terms of Reference as part of the post-implementation review of the changes made to the City Corporation's governance arrangements in 2011.

#### **RESOLVED-** That: -

- I. That the terms of reference of the Open Spaces and City Gardens Committee be approved for submission to the Court of Common Council in July, and that any further changes required in the lead up to the Court's appointment of Committees be delegated to the Town Clerk in consultation with the Chairman and Deputy Chairman; and
- II. That Members agreed no change was required to the frequency of the Committee's meetings.

## 5. OPEN SPACES DEPARTMENT, CITY GARDENS AND WEST HAM PARK RISK MANAGEMENT

The Committee considered a report of the Director of Open Spaces on the Open Spaces Department, City Gardens and West Ham Park Risk Management. The Director of Open Spaces introduced the report and invited questions from the Committee.

A Member requested further information on risks CR32 Wanstead Park Reservoirs and OSD 005 Pests and diseases. The Director of Open Spaces replied by confirming that the management of the Wanstead Park Reservoirs was one of primary risks for the Open Spaces Department and explained the current context of the project. It was explained that a panel engineer had been employed who would be producing a report on structure development options for the site. In addition, it was confirmed by the Director of Open Spaces that, while the risk at the Wanstead Park Reservoirs remains relatively high, Officers were confident that all required activities to mitigate this risk had been undertaken at this time.

In response to the Member's second question the Director of Open Spaces informed the Committee that, while not as significant as the peak at Hampstead Heath, the Oak Processionary Moth remained present across all the City of London managed open spaces and would be considered fully in a committee report due to be finalised later in 2020. Replying to a Member's additional question the Director of Open Spaces clarified that the problem of pest control in the City of London managed open spaces was a complex one with a varying

degree of success against differing pests at each site. The Chairman noted that this would be an ongoing concern for the Open Spaces Department which must be viewed in a long-term context.

#### **RESOLVED-** That: -

- I. The Departmental risk register be approved; and
- II. That the City Gardens elements of the City Gardens and West Ham Park risk register be approved.

#### 6. ST BOTOLPH BISHOPSGATE CHURCHYARD IMPROVEMENTS

The Committee considered a report of the Director of Open Spaces on the closure of the St Botolph Bishopsgate Churchyard Improvements project. The Chairman noted that he had been in communication with Archdeacon of London regarding possible works to improve churchyards within the City of London and would inform the Committee accordingly of any further developments on this matter.

#### Summary

This report provides an update to Members of the Open Spaces & City Gardens Committee on management and operational activities across the City Gardens section since July 2020.

#### **Main Report**

#### Finance

Overall expenditure for City Gardens is projected to be £90k overspent this
financial year due to a reduction in income generated from events and project
delivery, as well as personal protective equipment and other items that have
been required due to the coronavirus pandemic. Small on-site garden
improvements and other non essential purchases have all been stopped to
reduce pressure on the budget.

#### Personnel

- 2. City Gardens will be taking on two additional apprentices from January 2021. The first cohort of apprentices have now all successfully completed their courses. Two of the three have secured new fixed term contracts with City Gardens. The third apprentice's contract expires at the end of this year.
- 3. City Gardens currently have two vacancies for assistant gardeners, one which permission is being sought to fill, the other is being kept vacant.
- 4. The additional Gardener post for the Barbican which is being funded by the residents will be in post within the next couple of weeks.
- 5. Sickness levels have increased, this is largely due to staff self-isolating due to them or members of their household developing COVID-19 symptoms.

#### **Procurement**

- 6. City Gardens are currently carrying out a number of procurement exercises this financial year, these will help ensure that City Gardens continue to provide a value for money service:
  - Tree purchase tender This tender is due to go out in next two weeks.
  - Tree Inspection tender This is currently out to tender.
  - Christmas Tree tender this contract has been awarded to Christmas Tree World for the supply of an artificial tree.

#### **Operational Activities**

- 7. **COVID-19:** All City Gardens Depots have been assessed as COVID safe. All gardening front line staff have been individually risk assessed and are all back at work full time. Some adjustments to start and end times have been made to allow staff commuting via public transport to avoid busy times. All office based staff have been working from home and the Irish Chambers remain closed.
- 8. **Bunhill Conservation Management Plan** The City Gardens team have been working with City Surveyors to deliver a new Conservation Management Plan for Bunhill Fields. This document outlines opportunities and defines the management approach for this site for the next ten years, ensuring that the historical monuments are conserved, biodiversity and ecology is enhanced and that the visitor experience is improved.
- 9. **Biodiversity Action Plan (BAP) 2020:** City gardens are using the baseline survey on biodiversity that was commissioned to define the focus species and assist in setting targets and objectives for the new BAP. Work is also under way on strengthening the BAPs focus on pollinators and insects and the team are working with a number of external organisations on this. The aim is for the new BAP to be adopted in April 2021.

#### **Project Updates**

- 10. Covid Streets Programme 19 planters: City Gardens are working to support the Department of the Built Environment with the temporary greening measures. Phase one includes the installation of 30 trees in planters by the end of October. Six parklets are to be introduced at a later stage. Locations for the planters in phase one are at Cheapside, West Smithfield, Chancery Lane, Cursitor Street, Ludgate Broadway and Carter Lane junction, Creechurch Lane, Midddlesex Street.
- 11. **St Mary Aldermary:** The civil works are now complete, and the following has been achieved:
  - The paving has been re-laid and extended.

- The perimeter wall, which is a Surveyors asset, has now been rebuilt and is complete and stable
- The planted areas around the garden, have been prepared and will be planted by City Gardens.
- Benches are to be returned and installed shortly.
- 12. **Tower Hill Gardens play area:** A New type of play safety surfacing is being trialled on an area at the base of the slide that has become heavily compacted and difficult to maintain.
- 13. **St Bartholomew the Great:** This project is now complete apart from the installation of a bird bath. The following has been achieved; paving renewed and extended, new benches installed, a new Taxus hedge planted along the top of the retaining wall, new handrails installed to both sides of the steps leading to Little Britain. The central area under the two large Plane trees has been improved with manure and dug over and replanted. The long border facing Cloth Fair has been replanted by the Friends of City Gardens. The Worshipful Company of Gardeners have agreed to pay for new replacement plaques in the garden
- 14. **Moor Lane planters:** This is a temporary installation of several planters on the pavement area near the junction of Silk Street along the side of the Barbican. It is due to be installed in the next month. City Gardens will maintain these planters for approximately two years.
- 15. **Cursitor Street:** City Gardens have been working with the Department of the Built Environment on designing three raised planters within this street. The planters will be constructed in Corten steel and include seating. City Gardens aims to trial establishing lawn areas in shady sites, a crushed brick growing medium which is free draining will be used and it is hoped will increase the chance of establishment. It has been agreed that if the turf fails long term, the turf will be removed and replaced with a mixture of low growing plants and shrubs.
- 16. **2-6 Cannon Street (phase 2) Old Change Court/St Nicholas Cole Abbey:**This project is a redesign of the current area incorporating new beds and trees. It is also proposed that the area to the front of the Church (St Nicolas Cole Abbey) on Queen Victoria Street will also be planted. This project has been delayed due to issues with underground structures; planting is now not anticipated until early 2021.
- 17. **St Bartholomew's Close**: The relocation of two of the planters from outside Butchers Hall to the corner of Little Britain and King Edward Street is being carried out by the Department for the Built Environment and will have automatic irrigation.
- 18. **St Pancras Gardens –** A redesign and refurbishment of this garden that is to be funded by the owners of the garden is currently being considered. The

proposal is to reuse the existing paving, add new and additional planting, replace the seating and most notably to fence and gate this garden.

#### **Planning**

19. A list of planning applications that have been received since the last Committee meeting can be found in Appendix 1.

#### **Community, Volunteering and Events**

- 20. The Friends of City Gardens have been instrumental in helping with the delivery of St Bartholomew the Great.
- 21. The City of London achieved Gold overall winner in the Town category in this year's London in Bloom competition. The City Corporation was commended by judges for keeping its open spaces running efficiently to high standards during the COVID-19 lockdown and applauded the Square Mile 'rainbow' flower bed grown to honour key-workers fighting COVID-19.
- 22. The Barbican Wildlife Garden attained "Outstanding" in the Community Gardening Award. As did the City of London Gardener Nic Guerra, for his Rescue Nursery at All Hallows by the Tower, which City Gardens supports.
- 23. Plans for the Lord Mayor's Christmas tree lighting event are being discussed with Mansion House, in light of the COVID-19 restrictions. A decision on how to it will proceed will be made shortly and committee members will be advised.
