## Main Report

# Background

- The City Corporation adopted a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) in 2014 and the funds received have gradually built up as developments have proceeded. CIL Regulations require that 15% of CIL receipts be reserved for neighbourhood funding. Local authorities are required to engage with communities on how this neighbourhood funding should be used to support development of the area.
- In November 2019 the Policy and Resources Committee agreed a report to authorise a public consultation to identify priorities for the use of the City CIL Neighbourhood Fund and to approve draft governance arrangements for the management of CIL.
- It is proposed that the grant funding process could be managed by the CGU.
