Conditions Applied to Licences Granted by way of Delegated Authority

London Cocktail Club

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment, will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested.
2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer of the City of London Corporation. The log will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of customers
 - (c) any incidents of disorder (disturbance caused either by one person or a group of people)
 - (d) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol during the hours the premises is licensed to sell it.
3. A written dispersal policy shall be in place and implemented at the premises to move customers from the premises and the immediate vicinity in such a way as to cause minimum disturbance or nuisance to neighbours.
4. Prominent signage shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting that customers leave quietly.
5. Customers permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
6. The Licence holder shall make available a contact telephone number to nearby residents and the City of London Licensing Team to be used in the event of complaints arising.
7. A 'Challenge 21' Scheme shall operate to ensure that any person attempting to purchase alcohol who appears to be under the age of 21 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 21 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, a photo card driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card or similar document, or an industry approved proof of age identity card.
8. When the hours authorised by the licence extend to a time later than 1am, then in relation to the morning on which British Summer Time begins, the hours will be extended to one hour after the authorised hour on the licence.

Boutique Spirit Company

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested.

Oeno

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested.

2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- a. all crimes reported to the venue
- b. all ejections of patrons
- c. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- d. any incidents of disorder
- e. any faults in the CCTV system
- f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- g. all refused sales of alcohol

3. Prominent signage shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting that customers leave quietly.

4. The premises shall at all times operate a Challenge 25 policy to prevent any customers who attempt to purchase alcohol and who appear to the staff member to be under the age of 25 years without having first provided identification. Only a valid British driver's licence showing a photograph of the person, a valid passport or proof of age card showing the 'Pass' hologram are to be accepted as identification. Military ID Cards can also be accepted. Notices and/or posters advertising the Challenge 25 policy shall be placed in prominent positions at the premises.

Leonardo Royal Hotel London St Pauls

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times

when they are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested.

2. The premises will not hold promoted events, a promoted event being defined as follows: “A promoted event is an event where the musical entertainment is provided at any time by a disc jockey or disc jockeys one or some of whom are not employees of the premises licence holder and the event is (independent of the premises licence holder) promoted to the general public.

3. A complaints book shall be kept by the duty manager to record the date, time and nature of all complaints. This complaints book must be available for inspection by an authorised officer of the City of London or any other responsible authority.

4. The sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only.

5. Indoor Sports, Boxing & wrestling will only take place on Sub Basement level 2.

6. There shall be no live or recorded music on the roof terrace after 12am (midnight).

7. Films are permitted 24 hours a day in hotel bedrooms.

Le Pain Quotidien

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment, will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested.

2. Prominent signage shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting that customers leave quietly.

Piazza Italiana

1. Alcohol shall only be sold to a person sitting down eating a meal and for consumption with that meal.

2. Alcohol shall be sold to customers by waiter/waitress service only.

3. There shall be no self-service of spirits on the premises.

4. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, will be covered. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days.

Ninety One

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied otherwise than to:

- a) Directors, partners, officers and employees of the Licensee (and subsidiaries and affiliated companies thereof) and their bona fide guests
- b) Persons attending by prior invitation to a private or organised function in the premises a list of whom is to be kept at reception and made available for inspection by the relevant authorities immediately upon request.

2. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises, with the exception of alcohol sold for consumption in other non-licensed areas of the building or other premises occupied by the premises licence holder.
