### SA3 Community/Partnerships

Y11 mentoring in schools: 51 girls have signed up to undertake a volunteering placement after half term from 8 to 11 June in one of our seven partner schools, followed by another 44 on the second placement from 14 to 18 June. Students will be doing a mixture of mentoring (both academic and pastoral, for example talking to students about behaviour and choices), acting as classroom assistants, supporting with administration, paired reading and assisting with homework with the activities varying from school to school.

Our US College Counsellor will also be leading a week of US University Enrichment to support college applications and help the students to find the right fit for their ongoing education journey, incorporating too their co-curricular interests and hobbies.

We are also offering a more general careers and UK university programme lead by our Head of Careers. This enrichment will cover a range of topics around the

academic including self-awareness, presentation, coaching, employability, CV writing and input from alumnae who are immersed in their university careers. All topics are lead by specialist teachers from CLSG.
