The Member referred back to previous discussions relating to a wider Sports Development Strategy and questioned the progress being made in developing this strategy. The Director of Community and Children's Services explained the Sports Development Strategy was a corporate strategy sitting more widely than his team. The Director agreed to follow up with the Chief Strategy Officer and request an update be provided to the Committee.		The Sports and Physical Activity Strategy has three main outcomes; an audit of all of the City Corporation's sports and physical activity assets, a stakeholder engagement exercise to determine the views of residents and workers around sports and physical activity, and an assessment of the potential for revenue generation from any underused assets. The aim was to deliver these outcomes between 2020-2023. Due to the onset of Covid-19 at the start of the Sports and Physical Activity Strategy's delivery, we have had to rely on incomplete digital records of our sports and physical activity assets, and have been unable to conduct the planned inperson audits of the assets to assess their state of repair, usage and potential for revenue generation. However, we have been able to commission two valuable pieces of research on stakeholder views of leisure provision with UK Active and London Sport. The two research pieces explored the views of the City's residents and workers regarding the sports and physical activity offers which they would like to see the City Corporation providing. This research has been particularly relevant as it connects with the ambition of the City Recovery Taskforce to attract a greater number of people back into the City.
