Volunteering Update – August 2021

- -majority of volunteering programmes have resumed, approaching pre-covid levels of activity
- -over 4000 hours contributed by volunteers since April across approximately 300 volunteer sessions
- -restrictions on group sizes and recruitment issues easing
- -main **conservation and maintenance** programmes resumed on Hampstead Heath, Highgate Wood, Hill Garden, Golders Hill Park, Keats House and Kenwood Estate.
- -ongoing focus on litter and summer invasive species control, supporting Ranger Teams
- **-community** activities and outreach e.g. guided walks with Castlehaven Community Association, African Health Forum, Caversham Practice, family and youth activities with King's Cross Brunswick Community Association Somali families, NW5 play project, Holborn Community Association, the Winch, older people support with Camden Carers and North London Cares.
- **-wildlife monitoring** projects in full swing; ongoing support provided to London Natural History Society, Heath and Hampstead Society and ZSL with their respective surveys
- -over 100 youth volunteers involved to date on after school and weekend sessions
- -**Heath Friendly Schools:** Brookfield, Heathside, Swiss Cottage School, South Hampstead High School, Highgate School, the Village School, St Margarets get pupils involved in volunteering
- -wildlife interpretation sessions remain suspended
- -regular schedule of public walks and mindfulness (mental health) activities set up
- -resumption of **corporate** volunteering programme

Selected Highlights

Community Fun Day on 27th June a great success with carnival, live music and nature activities as part of the 150th Celebrations; alongside activities at rugby and athletics and kite event.

Five paid work experience placements provided for disadvantaged or underrepresented young people

In collaboration with ZSL, CoLC and H&HS a major **hedgehog survey** undertaken over summer

Free activities for **families and teenagers** provided throughout the school holidays as part of Heath Hands youth programme

Savernake Road bridge project landscaping began in late June, with further improvements and planting scheduled through Autumn
