

## Appendix 1 – Grants Approved, Withdrawn and Rejected

### Grants Approved

<b>Royal Society for Blind Children (ref. 18949)</b>	£48,646 towards the first year of operating costs for a state-of-the-art hub for blind children and their families, that will be located in the Square Mile.
<b>Maggie Keswick Jencks Cancer Support (ref. 17995)</b>	£254,827 to provide professional support for anyone with cancer and bring to life the Garden; providing seating, greenery and outdoor spaces for patients, visitors and residents.
<b>Becket Pageant for London (ref. 18026)</b>	£24,500 to bring City communities together post-COVID through creative collaboration around an original, inclusive, landmark cultural event; fostering skills and learning; rediscovering community outdoor theatre.
<b>St. Vedast-alias-Foster (ref. 18459)</b>	£25,000 over one year to make the churchyard of St Mary Staining at the corner of Oat Lane fully accessible by replacing the steep steps with a graduated incline, as follows:
<b>Age UK City of London (ref.18506)</b>	£48,171 to provide two-year funding for a coordinator to deliver a range of needs-led activities, whilst building and maintaining effective long-term relations with local agencies and services.
<b>Barbican Centre Trust (ref. 18557)</b>	£191,067 over 12 months to deliver a Creative Communities programme, collaborating with partners across the City to strengthen connections with and between neighbours and the culture on their doorstep; future funding for this work is conditional on receipt and approval of sufficient monitoring and evaluation.
<b>Globe Studios Limited (ref. 18558)</b>	£198,633 over two years to develop a creative studio and architecture/design library alongside a regular schedule of public, private and corporate creative classes.

<b>Learning Through The Arts (ref. 18614)</b>	£49,984 over two years to provide a series of children and family workshops for residents using multiple art forms from African drumming to Storytelling during the school breaks and holidays.
<b>Fleet Street Sundial CIC (ref. 18616)</b>	£31,250 over five years to create the Fleet Street Sundial Artwork with its associated information plaques and to upgrade the website and provide ongoing maintenance.
<b>Repowering Limited (ref. 18838)</b>	£33,660 over two years to support the capital costs for a 50kWp solar array to be installed on the Middlesex Street Estate and towards a two-year Community Champion role.
<b>City Property Association Limited (ref. 18847)</b>	£100,000 over two years to support the One City project, the City of London's digital community. Funding for year two is conditional on the CPA providing significant evidence of the impact of this work.
<b>New Diorama (ref. 18871)</b>	£154,640 over nine months towards salary, operational and related project costs at the NDT Broadgate creative hub.
<b>Outset Contemporary Art Fund (ref. 18864)</b>	£110,932 to support one year delivery partnership securing long-term creative infrastructure, and rapid activation using short-term projects, to achieve "Fuelling Creative Renewal" and "Culture/Commerce Taskforce" strategic aims.
<b>Historical Royal Palaces (ref. 18896)</b>	An initial £300,000 to celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and create a garden attraction for the City by providing access infrastructure to the Tower of London moat.
<b>Pollinating London Together (ref. 18909)</b>	£230,000 for the appointment of a full time ecologist and project manager, administration support, operational expenses and planting audits and pollinator nesting boxes
<b>The World Reimagined Limited (ref. 18837)</b>	£100,000 to fund the World Reimagined Sculpture Trail in May 2022.

<b>Temple Bar Trust (ref. 18843)</b>	£250,000 over five years to provide an educational programme for the local community, children and visitors, based in the refurbished Temple Bar and adjoining accommodation in Paternoster Lodge.
<b>Golden Lane Estate Residents' Association (ref. 18863)</b>	£50,000 to improve cycle parking and accessibility for residents and visitors on the Golden Lane estate.
<b>Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Mary-le-Bow (ref. 18880)</b>	£18,274 towards the modernisation and adaptation of the sound panels and sound control doors to improve sound control and safety of the Bow Bells.
<b>Royal Society for Blind Children (ref. 18949)</b>	£48,464 over one year towards the costs of the first year's operating costs of the Life without Limits Centre: a state-of-the-art hub for blind children and their families located in the Square Mile.
<b>Bevis Marks Synagogue Heritage Foundation (ref. 18025)</b>	£240,000 to improve access to the synagogue and deliver a programme of community outreach and education.

<b>Hounslow &amp; Whiston Cricket Club (ref. 18201)</b>	£27,842 to install an all-weather practice facility that will be accessible for the whole community.
<b>Sherwood Park Hall CIC (ref. 18449)</b>	£25,000 to improve Community facilities for the community to provide an environment for families, kids, and the elderly to create activities and tackle isolation
<b>Learning Through The Arts (ref. 18457)</b>	£109,496 to provide a series of children and family workshops for residents using multiple art forms from African drumming to Storytelling during the school breaks and holidays
