

Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule and appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives

Note: CCTV condition (number 1) has been amended to reflect that proposed by City of London Police and agreed by applicant by way of email on 30 November 2022)

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points will be covered enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show the police or the Licensing Authority recordings of the preceding two days immediately when requested (similar to MC01)
2. SIA registered security staff shall be appointed and deployed commensurate with the level of risk identified by the premises licence holder in consultation with the City of London police and/or Licensing Authority (similar to MC04)
3. A written dispersal policy shall be in place and implemented to supervise an orderly dispersal of visitors when leaving the property to ensure the minimum of noise and disturbance to local residents and businesses (similar to MC14)
4. Notices shall be appropriately displayed, in a place where they can be easily read, asking visitors to leave the site and the area quietly (similar to MC15)
5. There will be an effective age verification policy in accordance with the mandatory code. This policy will be one of Challenge 25 for age-restricted products and include the appropriate display of notices relating to the policy within the premises and in promotional material. These notices will indicate that any customer not appearing to have reached the age of 25 will be required to produce appropriate identification proving that they have turned 18 before being sold alcohol. Appropriate ID will be a valid passport, photo driving licence, PASS accredited proof of age card or other reliable photo-ID that is recommended and approved for acceptance by the police or other authorities (similar to MC20)
