Dear Sirs

The University of Chicago Booth School of Business at One Bartholomew Close is applying for a late-night licence:

1. To permit the sale of alcohol on and off the premises, 9 am – 3 am, Monday to Sunday.
2. To provide late night refreshment, 11pm – 3am Monday to Sunday.
3. To permit regulated entertainment, such as, recorded and live music, performance of dance, exhibits of film and provision of plays 9am – 3am Monday to Sunday.

As a resident of Percivall House which is opposite The University of Chicago Booth School of Business I am concerned about the potential for noise if this late night license is granted.

My concerns are:

1. The University of Chicago Booth School of Business is an educational institution and not a night club and therefore has no need for such a license.
2. The activities of the business school seem to include the showing of plays and films – these should be shown at the hours normally expected of cinemas and theatres and do not require a late night license.
3. The provision of music is also listed as an activity which in itself would give rise to a potential noise nuisance.

When 55 Bartholomew Close applied for a license restrictions were applied. Restrictions should also be applied to the University of Chicago Booth School of Business.

I object in the strongest possible terms to the granting of the license.
