Seats At The Table


- Co-design a table & chairs intervention to explore how to make dining accessible for all



CO-BUILD

CIRCULAR ECONOMY

April -July 2023 - workshops to be able to directly create installations and interventions out of waste, developing 'green skills' in, and knowledge of, the circular economy, retrofit and sustainable design.

Participants will learn the following:

- Material sourcing
- Inclusive design
- Designing with waste
- Producing minimal waste during construction
- · Design for disassembly.
