## Report – City of London Police Authority Board City of London Policing Plan 2025-28

To the Right Honourable The Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled.

## SUMMARY

The Policing Plan 2025-28 is a public document setting out the City of London Police's priorities for the next three years and how they will be achieved. The Court of Common Council is the 'police authority' for the City Police – the local body responsible for its oversight – and, in line with the Police Act 1996, is required to set priorities for it. This function is delegated to the City of London Police Authority Board.

This Policing Plan has been developed jointly by the City of London Police and Corporation's Police Authority team, incorporating comments from the City of London Police Authority Board, consultations with local residents, workers, and businesses, and with regard to relevant national strategies and statutory documents including the Strategic Policing Requirement (which details national strategic policing priorities, which all police forces must take account of).

This Plan has three operational priorities to keep people in the City safe and feeling safe, to put victims at the heart of all it does, and improve the national policing response to fraud, economic and cyber-crime. It has three organisational priorities to be one of the most inclusive and trusted police services in the country, be an employer of choice, and improve City Police productivity.
