Applicant:	Master Feltmaker - Worshipful Company of Feltmakers
Subject:	Original Feltmakers' Hall, City of London
Summary of subject(s) and their historical significance:	The Worshipful Company of Feltmakers traces its origins to the early livery companies of the City of London, playing a key role in regulating and supporting the felt-making trade. Historical research by the Feltmakers' Historical Committee has identified the location of the Company's third hall, which was destroyed in the Great Fire of London in 1666. The hall was located on, or adjacent to, the present site of the City of London School. This plaque would recognise the Feltmakers' contribution to the City's commercial and civic life, as well as the historical significance of the original hall's location.
Full address of location:	City of London School, Queen Victoria Street, EC4
Historical connection to the address:	The Feltmakers' third Hall dated from 1618, and destroyed in the Great Fire of 1666, was located near the site now occupied by the City of London School.
