A small organisation where the accounts presented show turnover of £285 in that financial year, nor do they have any paid employees. On this basis a grant cannot be recommended.	£20,000	CR Lambeth
11615 Harrow Equalities Centre	We seek funding for a new initiative "Know Your Next Door Neighbour". The aim is to establish dialogue, understanding and friendship between people in Harrow.	A poorly constructed proposal which does not address your priorities sufficiently well to warrant funding, particularly in terms of demonstrating impact.	£38,000	JGC Harrow

11678 Disability Action in the Borough of Barnet	To create an 'Anonymous Disabled Addiction Service' group to help sufferers recover from all types of addictions, aimed specifically for the disabled.	The proposal does not clearly address how it meets the priorities of this programme. Little tangible evidence of need for this project.	£85,700	KMG Barnet

11682 Brent Mind	Interventions to support older people with dementia access appropriate services. Promotion of dementia support amongst hard to reach elders.	Brent Mind's website highlights a range of older people's and culturally-based dementia services currently delivered in Brent. The application does not provide a convincing case for additional services nor sufficient detail on what service would be provided.	£112,000	JXM Brent

A grant as requested would make you the organisation's largest funder, which is contrary to your policy. Income has almost halved on the previous year.	£24,934	SD Lambeth
11792 Newham's Super Choir	To strengthen an existing choir of 25 elderly people and to increase its numbers to at least 50 by the end of the project year.	A very small, unregistered organisation. From the information provided a grant as requested would treble the organisation's turnover, which is not good practice.	£20,735	CR Newham
11795 Northwood Live at Home Scheme	A weekly exercise class for older people in Northwood, most over 80 years, using trained staff and volunteers, to supplement existing activities.	Parent body is Methodist Homes which has a turnover of £153M and free reserves of £25M. There is therefore sufficient scope for self-funding of this work.	£8,500	CR Hillingdon
11767 Waltham Forest Blind Association	Provide exercises strength training sport activities to the blind tackling being obese and overweight due to being inactive & imobility and reducing inactive related illnesses.	A grant as requested would make the Trust the organisation's largest funder, which is contrary to your policy. Some elements of the costings of the project appear excessive.	£24,238	CR Waltham Forest

11763 DPACT C.I.C	Empower disabled parents and carers to fulfill parenting/caring roles by giving them the necessary information and support to make informed choices and achieve maximum control.	At the time of application, the organisation had been established for only 8 months and is therefore ineligible as it is unable to provide examined/audited accounts for at least one full year.	£60,870	CR Croydon
