The City's population¹

The City has a residential population estimated to be around 7,400 (2011) evenly split between male and female. This is predicted to rise to 10,000 by 2026. In 2006, there was the highest number of births for years. This growth will place increasing demands on service provision.

The residential community has a lower proportion of older and younger people than the England and Wales average – indicative of a largely working population.

The City's population is predominantly white, but with a Bangladeshi community accounting for 4% of the total, mainly living in the east of the City. The second largest ethnic group in the population is Asian. This group has grown over the past decade. The City has a relatively small Black population, less than London and England and Wales.

Extensive consultation has taken place with key partners to develop the themes and commitments. This included a consultation event on 27 February 2015, attended by over 40 representatives from key agencies and sectors across the City.

The views of the City's looked-after children (LAC) and other young people in the City, gathered through an event organised by City Gateway, have also been central to shaping the themes and commitments.

C: Your Policy or Function

1. What is the main purpose of the policy or function?

The Children and Young People's Plan sets out the direction and goals for the City and its strategic partners, covering all services for children and young people up to the age of 19, and up to the age of 25 for care leavers and young people with learning disabilities.

The Plan includes services available for every child such as education, health and youth services; services for children who may need additional help for example with attendance, behaviour or health difficulties; and services for the small number of children with complex needs, such as children in care or those with disabilities.

The Plan sets out the vision for children, young people and their families and carers in the borough, and outlines the shared commitments and the anticipated outcomes that will emerge as a result of the work delivered.
