Summary			
To update SCP members on a) activity by the Community Safety Team not otherwise addressed and b) current progress against rough sleeping targets.

Summary

This report updates Members of the activities, not otherwise addressed in the agenda, of the Community Safety Team, plus a calendar of forthcoming events. In addition the current progress against targets for Rough Sleeping in the City is included.

Safety Thirst

1. The CST met with licensing colleagues to discuss this year's Safety Thirst scheme. The target for 2016 is to double the number of premises applying to the scheme compared to 2015. We will be working to target key premises (in addition to all those accredited last year). Work is ongoing to identify how to ensure the inspection process remains meaningful without being overly burdensome (to venues or those conducting the process). Community policing and other colleagues have indicated a willingness to assist.

2. We intend to keep to last year's timetable in terms of assessments and accreditation, with successful premises being informed in October. Members will wish to note that there are no plans to host an event on the scale of previous years.

City Community Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (CCM)

- 3. On 17 February we held the first City Community Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference. This is a new structure for professionals to share information relating to criminal and anti-social behaviour (ASB) within the City of London with a focus on risk.
- 4. It is intended that the CCM will provide an opportunity to look in depth at complex and high risk cases with a view to supporting action to reduce the level of risk. The CCM is an operational group, which will meet monthly, and it is intended to report into the Safer City Partnership (SCP). A paper setting out Terms of Reference of this group alongside the first report on its activity will be provided for 6 June meeting.
