2 Sundial Court lease extension

As the Board is aware, the School has been working with the City Surveyor for some time to secure an extension of the lease of Sundial Court, the School's hall of residence in Chiswell St. The existing lease provided for an extension for 30 years from September 2020. Given the strategic importance of this asset, negotiations were started with the freeholder in to achieve certainty as early as possible. The School is pleased to report that agreed terms were approved by the Court of Common Council at its meeting on Thursday 12 January 2017. This means that the School can count on continued use of the Sundial Court until September 2050. The City Surveyor may wish to provide an oral update at the meeting.

3 Teaching Excellence Framework phase 2 (TEF2)

As previously reported (19 September 2016, item 19, page 125) the School was among those institutions with a current satisfactory QAA audit and automatically received the single TEF award, together with permission to raise home tuition fees for 2017 entry. The Board subsequently agreed to raise the home undergraduate fee to the permitted maximum of £9,250 from autumn this autumn.

Institutions were invited to make a submission to the second phase (TEF2), on a voluntary basis by a deadline of 26 January 2017. Institutions will be assessed as gold, silver or bronze on the basis of a standard set of metrics derived mostly from National Student Survey and the destination survey) and a written submission of up to 15 pages.

A submission was drafted which underwent extensive internal and external scrutiny and the Senior Management Team agreed at its meeting on Friday 20 January that a submission should be made. The text of the submission and the supporting metrics are provided as part of the non-public agenda.

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
