The Mitchell City of London Charity and Educational Foundation

Awards are made in the following main categories

- Bursaries for the two years of sixth form study
- Choral bursaries
- Grants for age group 11-16 in a single parent family situation
- Pensions

In all cases the applicant must have the City of London qualification

- For Sixth Form Bursaries, Choral Bursaries and Single Parent Grants: either the child must be attending a City of London school, (this includes Christ's Hospital School, City of London Freemen's School and King Edward's School Witley), or have a parent who has lived or worked in the City of London for a minimum of five years
- For a pension application: the applicant must be of state pensionable age and have lived or worked in the City of London for a minimum of five years

6th Form <u>Bursaries</u>, <u>Choral Bursaries</u>, <u>Single Parent Grants</u>

- The applicant must be attending a fee paying school (includes state boarding schools)
- Usually the applicant must have been at the school for at least one year
- The annual award is currently £1950 paid directly to the school in three equal termly instalments
- Total family income in excess of £45,000 before tax will make it unlikely that a grant will be awarded unless there are special circumstances
- For 6th Form Bursaries the attainment at GCSE of six C's (or equivalent grade) or above is usually essential for support
- As at August 2017 Mitchell is awarding 9 Single Parent grants and 25 6th form bursaries (no Choral Bursaries at this time)

Pensions

- The annual pension is currently £400 paid in instalments of £100 per quarter
- In addition the Trustees usually make two extra gifts each year in June currently £125 to recognise the official birthday of Her Majesty the Queen, and in December currently £150 as a Christmas gift
- As at August 2017 Mitchell is awarding 25 pensions

Mitchell also makes an award per annum to Barts & The London and to City University

- Applicants are nominated by Barts and City
- The award is currently £2500 per annum, per applicant

Any other awards

 Usually an annual award in December to Providence Row – the award is currently £2000 p.a.

Trustees

- Four appointed by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London
- Two appointed by the governing body of Christ's Hospital School
- The Heads of the City of London School and the City of London School for Girls
- A maximum of nine co-opted trustees appointed by resolution of the Trustees
- Two trustees appointed to the Educational Foundation only:-
 - One appointed by the Senate of the University of London
 - o One appointed by the Council of the City and Guilds of London Institute
